Something's missing from book on Yosemite tragedy

FOR A group of 12 Carmel High School students and their five leaders, July 27 marked the 20th anniversary of a tragic event none of them could ever forget.

Yet a new book about a lightning strike that killed two young hikers on top of Yosemite's famous Half Dome fails to mention the role the group played in saving the lives of two other critically injured hikers.


"Shattered Air — A True Account of Catastrophe and Courage on Yosemite's Half Dome," by Shasta County author Bob Madgic, tells a remarkable — but incomplete — story of that day's shocking events.

Failing to heed warnings, a group of five hikers climbed to the top of Half Dome just moments before a severe afternoon lightning storm struck. The group from Carmel was sheltered safely on the side of the mountain as it waited for the weather to improve.

After the lightning subsided and the sky began to clear, a few hikers ascended Half Dome to watch the sunset. What they discovered at the top was horrific — one of the first group of hikers lay dead, two others were critically injured,

and a fourth had fallen from Half Dome, which towers 4,737 feet above the floor of Yosemite Valley.

The first hiker to arrive on the scene was a paramedic and realized immediately that a rescue was needed. Another hiker, who had even more experience with medical care, took control of the emergency. Not long after they began to work on the victims, the first members of the Carmel group arrived on the scene.



"Two new hikers appeared on the summit," writes Madgic in the book. "They said they, too, were EMTs [emergency medical technicians] and offered to assist. Renee Miller was in her early 20s, and the other was a man who only gave his first name, Brutus." The author left out the fact that both were with the Carmel High group.

According to Laurie Solon-Husby, a CHS graduate who was on the Yosemite trip, "Brutus" was one of their leaders. His real name was Bill Lester, a longtime resident of the Yosemite area and a man noted for his expertise in outdoor survival skills. Renee Miller was a resident of Carmel Valley

Popular tourist route closed through Labor Day weekend

A SMALL section of Scenic Road near Carmel Point that collapsed Aug. 6 will remain closed until at least the third week of September.

According to Vic Lewis, interim Monterey County Public Works maintenance manager, his staff is currently busy with a Carmel Valley Road maintenance project and won't be able to begin repair work until Sept. 6. And that date could slip further if any obstacles are encountered obtaining an emergency work permit from the California Coastal Commission.

For now, motorists have to take a detour around "Dead Man's Curve," perhaps the most dramatic section of the 2-mile-long Scenic Road. The traffic is being rerouted through a residential neighborhood.

The road failed after a 20-year-old repair project utilizing

Commission balks at timeline for sale of Flanders Mansion

■ Will it be put to a public vote?

SAYING THEY need more time to read the 348-page environmental impact report on Flanders Mansion, planning commissioners voted Wednesday to put off a vote on the sale of the historic home until Sept. 7.

Commissioners also asked for more information about whether selling the mansion would require a public vote.

The city council had hoped to have the commission's recommendations on the EIR's adequacy and the fate of Flanders in time for its Sept. 6 meeting.

Principal planner Brian Roseth recommended the commission find the EIR adequate in its review of the potential environmental impacts of selling the deteriorating mansion, which is surrounded by the city's Mission Trail Nature Preserve. He said selling or leasing Flanders complies with the general plan and Local Coastal Program and suggested the commission advise the city council to sell it, impose a number of measures to reduce the effects on public access to the house and surrounding property, and adopt conditions of sale that would limit what a private owner or lessee could do with the house and land.

The historic resources board met the previous night and concluded the EIR is adequate but decided to make no recommendation on whether the city should sell Flanders, he added.


Time to digest

Attorney Skip Lloyd asked commissioners to delay action on the EIR for a month, so that people could read and respond to the lengthy document released last week. He argued that allowing less than a week could be considered a violation of California environmental law.

"This has been debated for so long, and now it's at a crisis point where we have information in front of us," said Flanders Foundation President Melanie Billig. "We need

Pain-free walking is within reach for hip replacement patients

FOR MANY seniors, joint pain can be a major threat to their quality of life, because if it gets bad enough, it forces them to curtail activities they enjoy most.

But relief of even the worst pain in the most vital joint the hip — has become a lot easier, thanks to technological advances in hip replacement surgery.

Chaplan said most of his patients are more than 65 years old. The primary cause of hip-related problems is simply "wear and tear," resulting in damaged cartilage or the onset

People suffering from hip pain often put off surgery for years, fearing the impact it will have on their bodies — fears Chaplan said are usually unfounded.

ately after surgery," said Chaplan, who has a private practice in Monterey. "A common statement I hear from people is, 'I wish I had done this long

But Chaplan urges potential patients to proceed cautiously.

"Do it when you are ready," he said. "There is never a need to rush with this kind of surgery.'

If a patient decides to undergo surgery, an artificial ball-and-joint device will be implanted to restore alignment and function in the hip. Once surgery is complete, a

patient also can look forward to a quick recovery. Perhaps the biggest factor in reducing the recovery time is simply the size

of the incision, which leads to a less invasive procedure.

"We used to make a 12inch incision," Chaplan explained. "Now we make a 4-inch incision."

New technology allows medical personnel to "see through a much smaller hole," said Chaplan. "It's like building a ship in a bottle versus building a ship in your backyard."



While recovery times vary depending on age, health, techniques and severity of injury, patients typically are able to return to their previous activity level within four to six weeks.

Chaplan said Monterey Peninsula residents are lucky to have access to some of the most advanced surgical facilities anywhere.

"Our technology is right up to the minute," he said. "We're doing as good a job as any of the teaching hospitals in the country, such as Stanford or the Mayo Clinic."

The hospital is located at 23625 Holman Highway. Its main conference room will host the talk. Seating is limited to the first 150 guests and there is no charge.



Fugitive jumps bail, nabbed in Big Sur by park rangers

CALIFORNIA STATE Park rangers apprehended a sex-crime fugitive in Big Sur Aug. 9 who failed to show up in court for sentencing in July, said Dave Schaechtele, state parks spokesperson.

Ronald Wayne Hobbs, 52, was wanted on a \$1 million arrest warrant after he did not appear for sentencing in connection with an illegal locker-room videotaping scheme at a Moreno Valley high school in Riverside County in 2002

According Schaechtele, rangers were alerted to Hobbs after he was discovered illegally camping near the Big Sur Multi-Agency Facility, which is located adjacent to Pfeiffer Big Sur State Park. After the arrest, Hobbs was transported back to Riverside County.


Waiving his right to a jury trial, Hobbs was convicted in May of numerous of counts of invasion of privacy, a state penal-code violation related to filming, and burglary.



Sheriff: C.V. man posed as own caregiver to take \$\$

A 69-YEAR-OLD Rippling River resident bilked the Monterey County Department of Social and Employment Services out of \$18,413 by fraudulently cashing checks written to a caregiver who stopped helping him two years ago, according to the sheriff's department.

"The old man kept getting these checks to pay for the caregiver," Monterey County Sheriff's Sgt. Scott Ragan said Monday, though he would not release the suspect's name. "He wrote a letter to the department of social services changing the old caregiver's address to his own address, and he forged his name on some of these checks."

The alleged fraud was discovered after the Internal Revenue Service tracked down the man's former caregiver, 34-year-old Raymond Thompson, at home in Beaverton, Ore. "The IRS contacted him because Monterey County Social Services was reporting income for this guy that he wasn't getting," Ragan said. Thompson told the federal tax collectors he hadn't worked in

Monterey County since 2003. "That's what kicked off the investigation."

The Rippling River resident reportedly told deputies he was using the money to hire day laborers to handle tasks for him, such as laundry and cleaning, that Thompson had done. "He could be a total fraud," Ragan said. "Or it could be that the guy, rather than go through the red tape to get another caregiver, is hiring these illegals who hang out in front of Casey's."

Ragan said the man has not been arrested but could face charges of fraud, forgery and embezzlement. The sheriff's office is investigating further before sending the case to the district attorney's office for possible prosecution, and the department of social services is also looking into the case.



Test scores show Carmel's strengths, superintendent says

Unified School District Superintendent Marvin Biasotti said.

"Ten percent are more proficient than they were a year ago — more than double the state gain, which was around 4.5 percent," he said. "And in math, where we focused a lot of attention, we nearly tripled the state gain."

That success indicates the district's curriculum better matches what the state expects and that teachers have become more effective in helping their students learn it.

"We put a lot of effort into our entire program," Biasotti said.

Much of the work has been championed by Mary Bull, hired a year ago to oversee curriculum and instruction.

Teachers in similar grades make sure they are covering similar material and have similar expectations of their students — that they

Helicopter flyovers net \$5M in pot plants

SURVEILLANCE FLIGHTS over Los Padres National Forest this summer led a team of law enforcement officers to three gardens containing 996 pot plants, Monterey County Sheriff's Investigative Sgt. Doug Dahmen announced Monday. They hacked down and hauled out plants that would have produced almost \$5 million had they made it to maturity and onto the street.

Working with federal and state agents and county narcotics detectives, members of the federally funded County of Monterey Marijuana Eradication Team used helicopters not only to find the gardens deep in the brushy Ventana Wilderness several thousand feet above sea level.

"Our deputies were actually hoisted into the gardens, dropped in, and then the marijuana was hoisted out," Dahmen said.

They used machetes to chop down plants ranging in height from 4 feet to 10 feet, threw them into nets and flew them out, according to Dahmen. The pot will be stored at the sheriff's office while the growers are sought.

Several irrigation timers and other devices found at the scene could contain fingerprints, which investigators hope will be on file, either from prior run-ins with the cops or via a more mundane route — such as an application for a teacher's job.

"And if we locate someone, then we'll go back and confront them to find out why their prints were on a timer used in the middle of a national forest," Dahmen said. "And they'll say they touched it while it was on the supply shelf at

Orchard."

But with harvest season in full swing, Dahmen and his team are "running from garden to garden" and are more focused on finding the plants than investigating the cases. That will happen when the pace slows after the first winter storm.

"Right now we're more interested in getting the dope," he said.

About 85 percent of the marijuana plantings they find are on national forest or U.S. Bureau of Land Management lands, with the remainder in back yards — though some of those are permitted for medical use under Proposition 215, he said.

Using public property means less risk for the perpetrators, who could lose their own land and homes through

land and homes through

asset forfeiture if pot was found growing there.

"They go to great lengths to hide it — they might crawl a mile on their hands and knees through manzanita to find an area that's highly secluded, and then cut out the growth site and locate a water source," Dahmen said. "It becomes a very comprehensive operation."

In some cases, the cultivators will live in tents at their site



HE HAD to stop in the middle of the race to administer first aid to another rider who fell from her horse, breaking her wrist

Otherwise, Cachagua volunteer firefighter Bob Eaton might have finished higher in the 100-mile Western States Trail Ride last month.

Since 1955, the 24-hour race, also known as the Tevis Cup, has made its way through the Sierra Nevada backcountry from Robie Park to Auburn each summer. Finishing at all is a big accomplishment — especially for first-timers such as Faton

"The Tevis is like the Kentucky Derby of endurance riding, and it's about as high of a goal as you can set, just to be able to finish it," Eaton said. "The fact that I could was just amazing to me. And it wasn't me — it was my horse."

Astride Yahoo — whose name was inspired by his high-spiritedness — Eaton finished just 30 minutes shy of the cut-off, coming into Auburn at 4:48 a.m. July 24. First-place rider Cathy Richardson finished almost six hours earlier. But Eaton's 74th place is nothing to sniff at, as 199 riders started the race, while only 89 finished it.

Strict vet checks along the route are meant to ensure horses are not suffering any ill effects of such a grueling race, and those who don't pass muster are disqualified.

Injuries also take people out of the running, and Jan Jeffers, a six-time Tevis finisher and Eaton's mentor, didn't make it to the finish line.

As the duo rode through the Granite Chief Wilderness near Lake Tahoe, her horse slipped on a large flat rock and fell on her.

"She stuck her hand out to brace herself, and it broke her wrist," Eaton said.

With no way to summon immediate medical help, Eaton had no choice but to stop.

His trail-side ER work threw him off pace for the rest of the race. But Eaton was unfazed.

"Humans are more important than anything else in the whole wide world," he said.

Failing to finish in time because he offered help to a fallen rider also gave him no cause for pause during a 50-mile competitive ride at Lake Sonoma one year.

"A guy came off his horse and hit a tree, so I treated him for broken ribs. Then I was riding along and hoping I could finish, and I came across a woman with a broken collarbone," he said. "And then farther on, there was a lady who had been stung by bees and was allergic."


But his sturdy and fit horse carried Eaton along the mountainous Tevis Cup route, which fluctuates between 700 and 8,700 feet in elevation, in time to get his coveted finisher's belt buckle.


"He never took a wrong step the whole 100 miles," he said. "He was phenomenally strong."



Observatory will have a good view of life on the ocean floor

IF AN ambitious project proposed by the Monterey Bay Aquarium Research Institute survives the permit process, by next summer nearly 32 miles of fiber optic cable will be buried beneath the ocean floor, and an observatory manned by robots will be constructed 3,000 feet under the surface of Monterey Bay.

At a meeting last week in Costa Mesa, the California Coastal Commission postponed a decision on whether to allow MBARI to bury the cable. Despite the delay, MBARI public affairs representative Kim Fulton-Bennett said the research institute hopes to install the cable in November.

The completed observatory will cost \$12 million to \$14 million, Fulton-Bennett said. About half the price tag will be paid for by a \$7 million tax grant from National Science Foundation, and the rest of the bill will be covered by MBARI and other research institutions.


Named MARS — which stands for Monterey Accelerated Research System — the unmanned observatory will be located about 25 miles offshore.

According to Fulton-Bennett, the observatory represents a groundbreaking step in the advancement of marine research.

"Robots will crawl around the ocean floor

taking samples," he said. "They will measure the chemical properties of the ocean floor and study microscopic animals."

The observatory will also provide seismologists with data that could help predict earthquakes. Fulton-Bennett said "very expensive" instruments are currently recording earthquake data, but without the fiber optic cable, the devices need to be retrieved to access the information. 'We can find out about an earthquake that

happened six months ago, but we can't find out about one happening now," he said. The observatory could begin operating in

early 2006, Fulton-Bennett said. By next summer, he hopes the public will be able to view live footage captured undersea via the Internet.

The coastal commission postponed the hearing on the MBARI proposal last week

due to staffing shortages, explained spokesperson Sarah Christie.

"It was simply a workload issue," Christie said. "We had all our staff on the offshore oil issue. We had to review 36 oil leases and we had to do it in 90 days. It was an enormous undertaking. Our staff has been working seven days a week."

Christie said the coastal commission will conduct a hearing on the MBARI cable proposal at its next meeting Sept. 14-16 in Eureka.

According to Fulton-Bennett, the project is a pilot program for a much larger and more ambitious project.

"The U.S. and Canada are planning a multi-hub system off the coast of Oregon, Washington and British Columbia," he said. "It's called Project Neptune and it might not get off the ground for five or 10 years. We're talking about laying thousands of miles of cable on the ocean floor."

time to thoroughly review and digest it."

During budget talks more than a year ago, the city council decided to pursue the possible sale of some city property, including Flanders Mansion, the Scout House and Rio Park. It hired a realtor to assist in selling Flanders and — after being advised by attorneys it had no choice - voted to spend \$100,000 on an EIR. The first draft of the EIR was released in April; the revised draft, incorporating comments from more than 50

letter writers, was issued Aug. 10.

"I believe the time constraints of receiving this very long document are just too much for the average citizen to handle in such a short period and ask that you continue it so we can have a thorough discussion of it," said Karen Ferlito, who lives near Mission Trail park. "And if Carmel didn't have the park property it has right now and were going out to buy it, we couldn't touch the park land, value wise, that we already own. This is a legacy for people that is very, very much in danger of being lost."

Several other residents decried the potential Flanders sale as a shortsighted means of

funding capital projects — the main reason the council is pursuing the sale. Council members have also said putting the mansion in private hands is the best way to preserve

Vote or no vote?

Whether the sale of Flanders requires a public vote turns on the question of whether the mansion is a park, commissioners were told. According to the EIR, city attorneys do not agree about this.

Lloyd said the conflict arose because somebody at city hall wants to avoid an election and brought in another attorney to bolster that point of view.

"It appears the city council has gone outside its city attorney to get another opinion saying we don't need to have a public vote," he said. "I don't think that's good government or fair."

But Roseth said former Monterey City Attorney Bill Conners was hired to assist city attorney Don Freeman because he has experience with the sale of publicly owned historic properties.

Conners' advice was that "Flanders and the property immediately around it did not qualify as park land, not because of zoning, but because of its use," Roseth said. Flanders is zoned as improved park land, which allows it to be used as a private home, offices, a museum, or a hotel or bed and breakfast. For years it has been a residence or offices, not a park, Roseth said.

Chairman Bill Strid said each side of this argument should be articulated in the EIR so the city can choose which answer is right.

"I'm concerned the EIR only addresses the conditions and mitigation if we accept one of the expert opinions, that being it is not park land," he said. "However, if is park land, the EIR is silent on what the mitigation and effects would be, and I find that to be disturbing."



and feistiness. Eaton bought the horse six years ago at the age of 4. "Arabs are pretty tough, and he's a great example of tough."

He trained Yahoo for the Tevis, taking him on tough trails and competing in 50 or 60 shorter competitive rides that put more than 2,500 miles on the horse's official American Endurance Ride Conference clock.

"This was the first time I've ever attempted something quite as grueling," he said.

With temperatures soaring above 100 degrees during the race, the vets imposed stricter standards horses had to meet in order to continue, but Yahoo passed without a

Eaton also credited his crew, which included his wife, Peggy Eaton, and three other "horsey girls," for taking such good care of Yahoo during those stops.

And a daylight training ride through the

areas he and Yahoo would encounter in the dark during the Tevis also paid off.

"When he got to the point where he realized where he was, he was like a locomotive - he just kept going," he said.

Eaton was thrilled to cross the finish line in 23-and-a-half hours, just before daylight

Next year, the husband-and-wife team plan to return, though Peggy will be in the saddle and he will be armed with horse feed and wet sponges at the checkpoints.

The following year, Eaton hopes his adult daughter, Sarah, will ride. All will be astride Yahoo, of course.

The family owns several horses and is seeking county approval to open a boarding stable on property at Tassajara and Carmel Valley roads.

Eaton, who works a building contractor, said he would happily hang up his tool belt to work full time with horses.

"Horses are probably the cheapest therapy you could ever have. You get so connected to them," he said.

"I used to race motorcycles, but with horses, you are working with another mind — another being you want to enjoy things as much as you are.'



and was also accompanying the hikers from Carmel.

While Miller and Lester attended to the injured hikers, the man who discovered the victims ran more than 4 miles to a campground in Little Yosemite Valley. The book tells the story of how he found park ranger Colin Campbell brushing his teeth.

Meanwhile, Solon-Husby became aware of the accident when a dazed hiker straggled into the Carmel group's campsite.

"He looked like he was on drugs," recalled Solon-Husby, now an art teacher who lives in Pacific Grove. "He was saying, 'My friends are dead.""

Solon-Husby and a Carmel High student, Winston Aucutt, took off running in the direction of Little Yosemite Valley in the dark to find help.

"I knew there was a chance that a ranger or a trail crew would be in the valley," Solon-Husby remembered. "We found a trail crew camp, but only one person was there, and he didn't have a radio. Just moments later, by pure chance, a ranger came up on horseback." According to Solon-Husby, the ranger was Campbell — the same Campbell who, according to the book, was alerted while brushing his teeth.

Solon-Husby is sure her version is right. And she remembers being frustrated that Campbell "didn't believe us, and we had to convince him we were telling the truth." Finally he radioed for help.

Reached at Padre Island National Seashore in Texas, where he works as a ranger, Campbell said his memory of events that day is a little

"It was quite a while ago, and a lot of things happened that evening," Campbell said. "I do recall my horse, John Paul, was already tethered. It was late and I remember brushing my teeth when two folks came up and reported the incident. I can't remember if one of them was a woman."

Shortly after calling in the incident, Campbell and the trail-camp crew member rushed to the top of Half Dome with oxygen and other medical supplies. Campbell painfully hiked several miles in cowboy boots before asking a hiker to loan him his shoes.

What happened after Campbell started his hike toward Half Dome was perhaps the most astonishing part of the story. In Modesto, located about 100 miles west of Yosemite, an air ambu-

lance service called Medi-Flight dispatched a helicopter to Half Dome.

"I wasn't even considering the possibility of a night flight," Campbell said. "We had never done it before."

Thankfully, the pilot on duty was Al Major, a Vietnam veteran and a recipient of the Bronze Star, the Distinguished Flying Cross and 53 other Air Medal awards. After

Major airlifted the two seriously injured hikers from Half Dome, witnesses agreed the young men would not have lived had rescue efforts waited for daylight.

The two seri-

injured ously hikers who survived the ordeal — Tom Rice of Los Gatos and Bruce Weiner of Mountain View — recovered and have gone on to live relatively normal lives, although Weiner has some physical limitations. The two hikers who died were Robert Frith of Mountain View and Brian Jordan of Hayward. The fifth hiker, Adrian Esteban of Sunnyvale, survived virtually unscathed. He was





"I told them the

"I told them the weather was very bad and they probably shouldn't go up," she said. "[Rice] just about bit my head off. He said he wasn't afraid of the weather." Several other hikers present that day also related similar dialogues with Rice, according to the book.

The Carmel Pine Cone featured the story on its front page on Aug. 1, 1985. The article credits another Carmel group leader, Jymi Friday, as the first person arriving at the top of Half Dome after the incident.

If Madgic had seen the article, perhaps the book would have turned out differently. In an interview this week, Madgic said Miller and Lester were the two most important figures he was unable to locate.

He called the new information "more pieces of the puzzle." Regarding Solon-Husby, he called her story "interesting," but stuck to his belief that other hikers notified

Campbell of the incident.

Like Campbell, Anne Brocchini has a hazy recollection of events that happened two decades ago.

A 1986 graduate of Carmel High, Brocchini sprained her ankle on the trip, but she eventually made it to the top of Half Dome after the lightning storm passed.

"It's so long ago, and memories shift," said Brocchini, who lives in San Mateo and is the mother of an 8-month-old girl, Lena. "When we got up there, we heard someone had gone off the cliff, but we didn't know the condition of the others."

Nevertheless, Brocchini said members of the Carmel group were profoundly affected by the experience. "We spent a lot of time debriefing," she recalled. "We did some heavy processing. But it wasn't so traumatic, because we had people there who supported us. The leaders were fantastic."









Through the Tuscan hills

Chateau Julien owner Bob Brower bought a Dino 246 six years ago and a rare 275 GTS Spyder five years ago at the Brooks auction held alongside Concorso Italiano when it was at Quail Lodge.

Concorso has since relocated to Seaside, and the Brooks sale is no more, but Browers' Ferraris remain the main attractions in his garage.

Their arrival marked the rekindling of the New York-born Brower's romance with intriguing automobiles. It began in the 1970s with a vintage Mercedes and grew to include an exotic Italian De Tomaso Pantera, but his hobby went on hiatus after he sold his interest in a petroleum business so he and his wife, Patty, could pursue their dream of living on the West Coast. Captivated by Carmel, they opened their winery near mid-valley in 1982 and moved to Carmel Valley Ranch.

With the winery humming along, he had time for cars again and after a few years of hunting, brought home the Dino — "a real head turner" that seemed built for his 5-foot-9-inch frame — and then the Spyder — which hails from the days when Enzo Ferrari built his cars by hand.

The Spyder came with a bonus. Last June, Brower found himself among 50 enthusiasts invited to race through the Tuscan hills from one luscious meal or lovely hotel to another in celebration of the model's 40th anniversary.

"We had a police escort most of the time, and a sticker that said not to give us a ticket the rest of the time," he said. "It was a get-out-of-jail-free card. It wrecked my life!"

It also made him realize the magnitude of Italians' appreciation for all things automotive.

"Italy just loves its cars," he said. "People were lined up watching us race through the hills."

On Friday, the Spyder will have to settle for looking fast while sitting still, but Brower is confident it will win the



comprehensive operation."

In some cases, the cultivators will live in tents at their site for months and are often aggressive when inadvertently stumbled upon by hikers or found by drug agents. During a recent raid in Santa Clara County, a state warden was shot in the legs.

And California-grown weed is a lucrative crop, according to Dahmen. Low-grade pot imported from Mexico might run \$100 to \$200 a pound, but plants carefully cloned to yield the highest possible amount of the

intoxicating tetrahydrocannabinol, a common practice in California marijuana cultivation, will fetch \$5,000 a pound. A mature female plant will provide about a pound of product.

"Over the years, the THC content had increased dramatically — 30 years ago, they were 5 percent to 6 percent, but now they're 20 percent to 25 percent," he said. "As these people clone plants or work on the development of the plants, they're selecting plants that are of a higher yield and stronger, so it's more potent and more desirable."





The station, which is located off of Tassajara Road, runs exclusively on solar and wind power. Rain is collected to provide







He was never found, and the family suspects he has long been dead.


But Tony Parravano's cars can still be spotted at Concorso Italiano and the Rolex Monterey Historic Automobile Races at Laguna Seca.

The label for Ron and Michelle Parravano's private wine features his 1969 Alfa Romeo Spider.







The "Custom" Home Equity Loan



Hypocrisy and silliness

A PACIFIC Grove property owner who's been told he can't drill a well on his vacant land unless he has a Cal-Am hookup first has quite a few people to thank for his Catch-22. And he can start with local water activists, whose hypocrisy is remarkable.

Back in 1995, they convinced the state water control board to declare most of the Peninsula's water supply illegal.

The justification for this decision was the purported damage being done to the habitat along the Carmel River by overpumping. To protect the river's flora and fauna, the activists arranged for this community to be ordered to stop drawing most of its water from the river — a feat the state said was to be accomplished in the long term by creation of a large, new water project (a \$100-million-plus desal plant in Moss Landing is the latest proposal), and in the short-term by strict conservation measures and a moratorium on new water hookups.

But there's another way to reduce pumping from the Carmel River: Drill lots of new wells outside the river's watershed — because every drop of water drawn from a well in Pebble Beach or Pacific Grove is a drop that doesn't have to be pumped from the river.

But instead of lobbying the Peninsula's city councils and the board of supervisors to promote well drilling, the activists regularly do the opposite. The reason is as plain as the faucet on your kitchen sink: What the activists really want isn't restoration of the river. It's a halt to development. All development. That's why they don't want wells drilled in Pacific Grove or anywhere else.

But what about the supposedly responsible P.G. City Council that made the decision that well drilling was to be prohibited except when a property owner already has a water hookup? The reasoning advanced by city attorney David Laredo was that a well would *ipso facto* not be a reliable water supply. So unreliable would the well be, according to Laredo, the city would have to assume that eventually a house that relied on the well would need some sort of emergency hookup to the Cal-Am system — a risk the city could not take because the Cal-Am system, as we have just explained, has no water to spare.

This silly reasoning ignores the fact that wells are the most common source of water for domestic consumption in the world and have been used for thousands of years by millions of people with no difficulty whatsoever. Even layers of seemingly impenetrable granite, such as those that lie beneath Pacific Grove, commonly have substantial fractures filled with very large quantities of fresh water. (Most homes in the Sierra Nevada mountains rely on exactly this type of fractured-granite well.)

The city attorney's advice also ignores the fact that county health regulations already require private wells to be tested for quality and quantity before they are used to supply homes. The rules have been in effect for decades and have never been shown to be defective.

Can any private well be guaranteed never to run dry? Of course not. But the small chance that a well that passed the health department's strict tests might fail anyway has to be weighed against the property owner's constitutional right to make some use of his land.

It also has to be weighed against this fact: With the state's 1995 cutback order still hanging over the commmunity's heads, and with no drought reserve in place after all these years, who says the water pipeline that runs down the middle of your street is reliable?

are in effect all teaching the same course, Biasotti said. Faculty regularly confer on what they expect students to know and be able to do as they progress through the grades, so that pupils will not have gaps in their learning.

And teachers have developed a better understanding of the cognitive skills the exams are designed to assess, according to Biasotti. "The biggest single contributing factor to why these scores rose as much as they did is the hard work of the classroom teachers," he said.

Also fewer higher-achieving students opted out of taking the tests, and they seemed to take them more seriously, according to Biasotti, particularly at the high school.

The scores will be used to calculate the Academic Performance Index, which is released each spring and shows how well the schools performed in comparison with others

'All students can do high-level work'

The superintendent said the school system believes "all students can learn and can do high-level work" — so they should not be divided into groups based on perceived learning abilities, he said.

Biasotti touted better measuring of students' progress in the classroom, so that teachers can intervene as early as possible if they need to get a low-performing student on track.

And two new programs high-school programs will welcome students when classes begin Aug. 23.

Freshman Focus will "connect new students with mentors, helping them understand how the system works and getting them grounded in the high school so that it's not an overwhelming experience, but one where they feel supported and cared for," Biasotti said. It will give incoming freshman "a place to turn with the inevitable questions that come up."

Biasotti hopes these changes, and others in the works, will help Carmel Unified students have among the highest graduation rates in the state.

According to Paul Behan, also with CUSD, 89 percent of the high school sophomores, juniors and seniors who took the English language arts exit exam passed it, and 92 percent passed the math exam. The 23 students who failed the English test and 16 who failed the math test can retake them. If their senior year ends without their passing the tests, students receive a "certificate of completion" rather than a high school diploma, according to Behan.

concrete bags collapsed, Lewis explained.

To protect the road against a future collapse, earth anchors will be drilled into the existing topsoil, said Lewis. A rebar framework will be tied to the anchors and a wire mesh will help hold the concrete in place.

"The concrete will be dyed or stained the color of the native rock," Lewis said. "It will be unrecognizable."

If there is no more erosion, the repair project will cost less than \$20,000.

■ *Highlights of the* 2005 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance

HEN PEBBLE Beach Concours d'Elegance organizers announced last year that Alfa Romeo would be a featured marque at their 2005 show, they hoped to attract a sizable assortment of vehicles from the 95-year history of the Italian automaker. Their expectations have been greatly exceeded.

The Sunday, Aug. 21 Concours will feature "the most significant display of classic Alfa Romeos ever assembled — anywhere," said Co-Chairman Glenn Mounger. "Among the 62 Alfa Romeos coming to

These imaginative concept cars from the 1950s, affectionately known at BAT 5, BAT 7 and BAT 9, will be dis-played at the Concours, as they were in 1989.

Pebble Beach, there'll be seven cars from the Alfa Romeo Museum (outside Milan) as well as three of ultra-imaginative BAT (Berlinetta Aerodinamica Tecnica) concept cars from the '50s."

Overall, 27 of the 62 Alfa Romeos participating at the Concours are being shipped from other countries, including the BAT 5, BAT 7 and BAT 9, which now reside in London.

"The first BAT (5) was built in 1953, when most other carmakers had never even imagined tailfins and long before there was a Batmobile on television," says Moun-

"The BAT 7, built in 1954, was even more radical in design with huge curved tailfins. And the final BAT — the BAT 9 — was built in 1955 with reduced wings and a design that was closer to a production sports

"We're looking forward to an historic reunion of these incredible cars. The last time they appeared together anywhere in the U.S. was the 1989 Pebble Beach Concours."



accomplished another rare automotive feat: In one weekend, he captured the 1955 Pebble Beach Road Race to win the Del Monte Cup and won the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance.

To celebrate the 50th anniversary of this improbable double victory, Hill,

with his '55 Ferrari 750 Monza (courtesy of owner Jim Hall) and '31 Pierce-Arrow, will be honored guests at the Concours.

The Pebble Beach Road Race, conducted from 1950-1956 in Del Monte Forest, was advertised as "Thrilling European Style Racing Featuring the World's Fastest Sports Cars." Hill was a three-time winner: 1950 in a Jaguar XK120, 1953 in a Ferrari 250 MM and 1955 in the Ferrari Monza.


"That was a very serious, very competitive race back then," says Hill, noting that the course wrapped through a forest and was driven partly on dirt. "And I remember it raining in '55, so it was especially difficult."

The Concours gave Best of Show honors to modern vehicles during the event's initial five years. Then Hill's '31 Pierce-Arrow took top honors in 1955.


"So much of the bias back then was in favor of Rolls Royce that I didn't expect to win," says Hill, who still owns the '31 Best of Show winner. "Even though I thought I had the best car, I was definitely surprised to win."

Hill, who lives in Santa Monica, retired in 1967 with a 20-year racing resumé that included three wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans, three wins at the 12 Hours of Sebring and victories in his first race (at age 19) and final race (BOAC 500 at Brands Hatch in England). While his racing days may have concluded, Hill says, he by no

means retired from his "obsession with cars."

He and his wife Alma won the 1977 Pebble Beach Concours Best of Show with their 1927 Packard convertible sedan; he has worked as a TV commentator for ABC's Wide World of Sports, and he writes for numerous publications.

Additionally, his son Derek drives professionally, winning the Barber Dodge Pro Series title in 1997 as well as taking his class at the 1997 24 Hours of Daytona and 12 Hours of Sebring.

"I was a racing buff and a grand prix enthusiast from childhood," says Hill. "I actually remember being a car freak at age 2, and I've truly been lucky that cars have encompassed my whole life."

Hill's Concours calendar includes an appearance at RetroAuto (the new 13,000 square-foot shopping area at the Concours), where he will be signing books and discussing his racing career. And he will serve as an honorary judge at the big Sunday event.

■ First the Concours . . . then a museum

THE LEGENDARY Mercedes-Benz 300 SLR of Sir Stirling Moss will make its final public driving appearance at this year's Pebble Beach Concours. Moss, the British grand prix and long-distance racer who piloted the No. 722 car to victory at Italy's Mille Miglia in 1955, will drive the SLR across the judging ramp in front of The Lodge at Pebble Beach to complete the 50th anniversary celebration of the victory. Following Pebble Beach, the SLR will be retired to the new Mercedes-Benz museum that is currently under construction in Stuttgart, Germany.

Moss, who won 16 grand prix races and was knighted for his driving prowess, feels the '55 Mille Miglia was his greatest race.

"Even now, so many years afterward," he says, "the memory is fresh. Of all the races I entered, and finished, and even of those I won, I can't find another to compare with it."

With his navigator, the late Denis Jenkinson, Moss drove the 990-mile road course (from Brescia to Rome and back) in an amazing 10 hours, seven minutes and 48 seconds at a record average speed of 97.95 mph.

Moss chose Jenkinson, a journalist, because he didn't weigh much and because he developed a written navigation system that is the father of today's "road books" used by World Rally participants.

Jenkinson meticulously recorded the optimum speeds for each corner on long, narrow strips of paper during the test sessions and then read back the information to Moss during the race.

The '55 Mercedes-Benz team at the Mille Miglia also set a historical precedent for quick pit stops. "They cleaned the dead flies off the screen and poured 18 gallons of fuel into the tank," said Moss. "A Mercedes man in a white coat held a tray of cold tea, coffee, chocolate, peeled bananas and anything else you could eat while the refueling was going on. They sent us on our way in just 28 seconds."

Daimler-Benz built the SLR specifically for the 1955 competition season. In the days when road cars typically developed less than 100 horsepower, the SLR made 310 out of a 3-liter, 8-cylinder Formula 1 engine and had an estimated top speed of 186 mph.


In addition to success in the Mille Miglia, the SLR and Moss were also victorious at the Tourist Trophy in Northern Ireland and the Targa Florio in Sicily. The latter win led Mercedes-Benz to the World Sports Car Championship.

Since "retiring" from competition, the No. 722 SLR has been seen at many historic races, including the Monterey Historics and, most recently, the 23rd Historic Mille Miglia in May.

But the Mercedes-Benz factory has decided to place it in a permanent home, so auto enthusiasts will have their final chance for many years to come to see the renowned endurance race car outdoors at the Pebble Beach Concours.

■ *The return of* the Hot Rods

CUSTOMIZING, A close off-shoot of hot rodding, began on the West Coast in the 1930s and reached its peak as a national trend in the 1960s. The premise was simple. Customizers, both amateur and professional, restyled lower-priced cars like Fords, Mercurys and Chevrolets so they'd resemble expensive brands and later models. With coverage by magazines like Hot Rod and Rod & Custom, the practice of customizing soon spread nationwide.

The Aug. 21 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance will showcase this styling trend in its 2005 Hot Rod Class, a specially judged category sponsored by Ford Motor Company.

"We're assembling some of the earliest, most influential examples of custom cars," said Glenn Mounger, co-chairman of the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance. "The earliest customs are arguably the purest in concept, relying on extensive metalwork and selective use of items like grilles, hubcaps and headlamps from other cars of the period. They're beautiful examples of automotive artistry and set trends that continue to this day."

The formative era for custom cars was immediately before and directly after World War II. Body work ranged from chopped and filled hard tops to fender skirts as well as partial-to-complete body dechroming. Additionally, suspensions were lowered so custom cars assumed a more streamlined look and paint finishes became important, with customizers developing hues like "candy apple red" as well as pearlescent.

"Our intent is to showcase the early history of the

Racetrack benefactors drive with heart

HEN IT comes to racing vintage automobiles, few have invested more time, more money and more passion in their local tracks than Rodney Smith and Ned Spieker, Jr. One is a retired high-tech exec and the other a successful entrepreneur and real estate investor. Recently the two men "took a financial interest," as they modestly put it, in the track they've been driving during the Monterey Historic Automobile Races for years.

In return, they earned the right to take over Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca for a couple of days each year. To raise money for the nonprofit track improvement fund, they hosted their inaugural

Laguna Seca Charity Invitational last month. And the men will again race in the Rolex Monterey Historic Automobile Races presented by Chrysler Aug. 19-21.

Rodney Smith

"I've always been interested in older cars. Even when I lived in England, I used to collect and restore old sports cars," said Smith, who came to the United States in 1967, first settling on the East Coast. "In those days, you could buy old sports cars for almost nothing and work on them."

He began racing in Sports Car Club of America events in 1969 and continued for a couple of years until he moved west.

Checking out the inaugural Monterey Historic Automobile Races rekindled his need for speed.

"In 1973 Steve Earle was doing the first Monterey

Historics, and I heard about it and went down as a spectator," he said. "It was sort of fun."

At the birth of Earle's event, many contestants drove or towed their race cars to the track; large trailers were rare, and spectators numbered in the dozens, not tens of thousands.

It was in that early era that Smith began racing a 1930 Riley, which he continued driving even after taking the helm of high-tech semiconductor company Altera in 1983 as its CEO.

Since retiring in 2000, Smith has more time for vintage racing, including his native country's famous Goodwood Festival of Speed, hosted by the Earl of March.

Though he's "doing it less and less, because it's extremely competitive," Smith regularly finds himself behind the wheel in Europe. He often calls upon friend and Automobile Magazine Executive Editor Mark Gillies to drive with him, or for him.

The two recently shared the driving in Italy's famous Mille Miglia — a 1,000-mile race along the country's open roads — in Smith's Maserati 300S.

"It's basically an exercise in sleep deprivation," he

custom car, when talented bodymen, some of whom had earlier worked on custom classic coachwork, turned to restyling," said Ken Gross, Pebble Beach Concours' Hot Rod Class chief judge. No show has ever gathered all these cars together before and several of the entries have not been seen in public in many decades."

■ 1,500-mile trek to Pebble Beach

PLANES, TRAINS and automobile transports are the preferred modes for shipping rare classic cars, sometimes worth millions of dollars, to the world's most exclusive collector car shows. For this year's Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance, an alternative transportation method debuted — the Pebble Beach Motoring Classic, a scenic 1,500-mile trek from Seattle to Pebble Beach.







said.

Drivers depart Brescia at 8 p.m. and get to Ferrara at 2 a.m., find their hotel, sleep a few hours and leave at 6 for Rome, arriving around midnight and departing at 6 the next morning for the home stretch.

"By the time you get back to Brescia, you've done two-and-a-half days of driving with a total of seven hours of sleep," he said. "But it's a lot of fun."

The Mille Miglia takes drivers through old hill towns and areas nor-

mally barred to automobiles, such as the central square in Siena.

"And the spectators are just wonderful," said Smith. "They go crazy over there for the cars."


But Smith said nothing compares with the Monterey Historics, during which Gillies will driving Smith's 1934 ERA single-seater, "which usually wins its class," and Smith will command his 1954 OSCA MT-4.

"We look forward to it every year," said Smith. "It's the only event my wife will go to."

While he's driven the 2.238-mile Laguna Seca circuit many times, Smith has the advantage of having raced it just a few weeks ago during his invitational. It was the first time he'd been on the tarmac since \$2 million in safety improvements were made for July's U.S. Red Bull Grand Prix world championship motorcycle races.

"The track has a different visual aspect in a couple of places," he said, such as Turn 9, where a footbridge was moved 150 yards back up the track toward the Corkscrew.

Smith speculated it runs a second to a second-and-a-half quicker per lap and hopes that translates to a good finish in his OSCA, which he will drive in the first group Saturday, Aug. 20.

"To me, Laguna Seca is one of the smoother tracks. Infineon [in Sonoma] is much more bumpy," he said.

Ned Spieker Jr.

Spieker called the Monterey Historics, in which he will drive an Alfa Romeo and a Lotus "just fabulous," and called Steve Earle "an artist" whose promotion of historic racing has been a credit to the entire Monterey Peninsula.

"It's fun for people to come to Monterey and Carmel and have the racing and the quality of the cars he attracts from all over the world. It's just magnificent."

Spieker estimated only a quarter or a third of the racers who want to drive at the historics actually get in.

One of the fortunate for just the past several years, Spieker began vintage racing after taking a Skip Barber Racing School at Laguna. But he's long been a car guy.

"I've been interested for decades — a little boy who hasn't grown up," said Spieker, who was born and raised in the San Francisco Bay Area and works in the real estate business. Spieker Properties was the original developer of Ryan Ranch, among many others, and he sold his successful company to Equity Office Properties, the largest office space company in the United States.

Before he started racing them, Spieker restored collector cars, including the 1923 Rolls Royce that won its class at the prestigious Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance 20 years ago.

"That's what led me to vintage racing," he said. "Because I got a little bored with standing around looking at cars and much prefer to drive them."

He ended up donating the Rolls to the Blackhawk Museum, which will also have an exhibit in Pebble Beach during car week.

"It deserved to be used, and I wasn't using it," he said.

He now races "more than half a dozen" vintage cars and will be driving a 1932 Alfa Romeo P3 monoposto, an open wheel grand prix race car that won the world-famous Monaco Grand Prix and many other grand prix races in the 1930s.

He doesn't even remember where he bought the

"A couple of years ago it kind of found me," he said. "I wanted something that was rare and fast, and this was the car."

Last year, he took the Alfa back to the hallowed streets of Monaco, one of the stops in a season of racing for which Spieker flew two race cars overseas. His mechanic and transporter accompanied him.

"That was one of the biggest thrills of my life, especially knowing that car had been at Monaco decades before," he said. "It was very challenging driving — you can't make any errors there, because there's no runoff — but it was fun and there were many, many people. The atmosphere was just electric."

He described racing through the circuit's signature tunnel, with its contrasting light and darkness and the reverberation of vintage auto engines.

"That's the fastest part of the track and very excit-





ing," he said. "Nowhere in the world do you go through a tunnel at your highest speed. It's really a rush."

He hopes to race the Grand Prix de Monaco Historique when it's held again next May.

He's eager to flex the Alfa's muscle at the Monterey Historics, which he called "the largest event of its kind in the world." He'll race the Alfa in the second group Saturday afternoon and his sleek 1963 Lotus 23 in the third group Sunday.

He also appreciates the work done at Laguna this summer.

"It's a better track than it ever was," he said. "It makes it more fun, because we can use the curbs, so it's a faster track."

Their charity invitational

Smith and Spieker were overjoyed with their inaugural July race to raise money for the track, which is part of a Monterey County park and run by the nonprofit Sports Car Racing Association of the Monterey Peninsula. As substantial financial supporters of the raceway, they decided to use their free track days "to hold an event for our friends and make it charitable while having the fun of racing our cars," Spieker said.

They modeled the event after the car-club races of 20 or 30 years ago, seeking a more casual and social atmosphere.

No spectators crowded the paddock, and fine food was served rather than the usual track fare. Racers also gathered off-track at area restaurants, such as Tarpy's Roadhouse just down the highway, to share race-related stories of fortune and failure.

Or, as Smith put it, "to sit around and tell lies."

"The main thing was just to have a good time and enjoy driving," he said. It seems that everybody did.

"We received a lot of good feedback saying, 'Don't change a thing. We really liked it. This is the way it used to be," Smith said. "We had a lot of email thanking us for doing it and hoping we'll do it again, which we will, of course."

One hundred cars were raced July 19 and 20, and the drivers' fees raised more than \$30,000 for the nonprofit 501c(3) Laguna Seca Raceway Fund, according to Spieker. Smith drove his 1958 Jaguar Special, while Spieker raced his Lotus. He'd intended to run a Brabham as well, but it broke, and he ended up with a substitute he didn't much care for.

Their financial interest also netted them seats on SCRAMP's executive committee.

"We try to bring a business perspective to some of the things that SCRAMP does," Spieker said.

The money their annual invitational raises will help make Laguna's facilities reflect the track's world-class track status, he said.

That, in turn, will draw more spectators, raising more money for the

charities that benefit from the four or five major events held there each year.

Massachusetts move doesn't keep Woudenberg from emcee duties

STILL remember very clearly sitting in Dr. Woudenberg's class at Robert Louis Stevenson School in Pebble Beach, listening to him recite the famous line by 17th century philosopher Thomas Hobbes: "Life is solitary, poor, nasty, brutish and short."

Above all other philosophical summations we discussed in that class, that one stuck out the most. Perhaps it was because, as a student in an exclusive school in a wealthy neighborhood, the harshness of life described by Hobbes was a bit difficult for me to fathor.

Or perhaps I was fascinated by the contrast of this ultimate statement of political cynicism being uttered by one of the most vibrant, accomplished persons I had ever met.

Dr. Paul Woudenberg moved in June after a 30year stint as a Monterey Peninsula resident. He and his wife, Emily, relocated to Yarmouth, Mass., on Cape Cod to be closer to family, including their

two daughters and a 2-year-old granddaughter.

His day job for the last 20 years was teacher of religion and ethics at Robert Louis Stevenson School in Pebble Beach and minister of the Church of the Forest, also on the RLS campus. But he was widely known around Pebble Beach as a community leader and expert on classic cars.

The Voice of the Concours d'Elegance, Woudenberg has been the annual car show's

announcer since 1980, a role he took on after being a chief judge of European Classics at the P.B. event since 1975. He first judged in 1972, though his Concours roots began growing long before that.

With more than 200 cars having passed through his collection, he has entered several of them in the Concours, beginning in 1957 with a 1933 Rolls Royce Phantom II, one of only 12 in existence.

As impressive as it was to show up with such a rare car, he quickly realized what kind of crowd he was dealing with when someone mockingly asked, "Do you drive this every day?" Woudenberg admits that it was in rather "shabby" condition.

He went on to enter several more cars, experiencing only marginal success as a contestant.

"The best I ever placed was second in a category," Woudenberg explained, referring to a 1923 Lincoln. "And that was in a category with three cars."

While none of his cars ever stole the show, Woudenberg himself is a well revered celebrity of the event. Last year he was awarded the Lorin Tryon Trophy in recognition of his outstanding contribution to the Concours.

His credentials in the automotive world aren't limited to the Concours. He is the author of six books on classic cars and numerous articles for automotive journals, and his personal library includes about 2,200 books on automobiles, establishing him as an expert on all types of classic cars, something he must be if he is going to deliver well-informed descriptions of the more than 200 yearly entries that could win their classes, or even Best of Show, on the 18th Fairway.

Besides his role with the Concours, Woudenberg was a staple of the Pebble Beach community before leaving the area. Praised by Jack Kidder, president of the Del Monte Forest Property Owners, for his "Solomon-like wisdom and diplomatic demeanor," he served as president of the DMFPO and the Del

Monte Forest Foundation and sat on the boards of the Carmel Bach Festival and the Monterey Symphony.

A U.S. Navy veteran of World War II, Woudenberg's life before he moved to the Peninsula

was just as full. He earned his Ph.D. from Boston University in textual criticism (the analysis of Greek manuscripts). Two visits with Nobel Peace Prize winner Albert Schweitzer also helped turn Woudenberg into a noted scholar and lecturer on Schweitzer's life and accomplishments.

A former member of the Los Angeles County Narcotics Commission, Woudenberg was a minister at the First Methodist Church of Santa Monica before moving to the Peninsula in 1975 to take up the same posi-

tion at the Church of the Wayfarer in Carmel.

Despite his departure for Massachusetts, the Del Monte Forest and the Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance will continue to get at least a small dose of the doctor every year. Woudenberg will return every August as the Concours announcer, a role he intends to fill for a while.


