Police scanner aids in arrests after P.G. attack

A MAN listening to a police scanner at his Del Rey Oaks home during the wee hours of the morning Saturday helped police arrest four men suspected in the vicious beating of three military servicemen on the Pacific Grove recreation trail.

Charles Clifton III, John Mercurio, Joseph Thomas, all of Monterey, and Tyler Roy of Seaside, were taken into custody in Del Rey Oaks shortly after the assault at 2:15 a.m. on the 300 block of Ocean View Boulevard.

"There is no real motive behind this," Pacific Grove Police Commander Tom Uretsky said of the assault. "It was random."

And so was the way police were able to catch the alleged assailants.

After the attack, police put out an all-points-bulletin in an effort to find the men, who were reported to be in a pickup truck, Uretsky said.

"There just so happened to be a person sitting up late at night listening to their scanner," he said. "And he heard the APB go out."

Court sides with would-be builder

A CALIFORNIA appeals court upheld an appeal by a San Luis Obispo County would-be homebuilder last week, striking down an attempt by the California Coastal Commission to restrict development that would jeopardize views from the ocean of boaters, kayakers and surfers.

The ruling by a state appeals court represents a big victory for Daniel C. Schneider, who hopes to build a 10,000-square-foot home on 41 acres he owns just south of Cambria. The deci-

Post office likely to rehang Bates' art

SUPPORTERS OF cartoonist Bill Bates were pleased Thursday with the announcement by the U.S. Postal Service it's "leaning very favorably" towards rehang at least some of the artist's cartoons in the Carmel Post Office.

The longtime Pine Cone artist's illustrations, which portray the idiosyncrasies of Carmel life, were taken down from the walls of the post office two weeks ago after being a fixture there for two decades.

"That is very good news," said Barbara Livingston, a former Carmel City Councilwoman and Bates' supporter. "This is a step in the right direction."

On Monday and Wednesday, Livingston and others helped collect more than 1,000 signatures in a petition drive to encourage postal officials to place the cartoons back on the walls of the Fifth Avenue post office.

The postal service's announcement that it wants to resolve the issue followed a Thursday meeting between postal officials and Rep. Sam Farr, D-Carmel.

"If we can't accommodate them (cartoons) all, maybe there is an opportunity to put some of them back up," said postal service spokesman Gus Ruiz. "Maybe make it an event, and the community can decide

Foes offer two remedies for C.V. woes

BOTH PROPONENTS and opponents of Carmel Valley's incorporation agree on at least one thing — each side wants to see the area's "rural character" preserved for posterity.

While proponents insist the best way to do that is to give Carmel Valley its own city council and planning department, opponent Bob Sinotte has been floating another idea. He is lobbying for the creation of what he calls a "Carmel River Valley Land Trust."

"A land trust could be the ultimate evolution of the incorporation process," explained Sinotte.

According to the Land Trust Alliance, a land trust is a nonprofit organization that, as all or part of its mission, actively works to conserve land by undertaking or assisting in land or conservation easement acquisition, or by its stewardship of such land or easements. In other words, instead of fighting over a piece of land in the political arena, conservationists would simply buy the land, or an easement protecting it, thereby controlling its development.

Sinotte's idea might sound good in theory, but is there enough money to pull it off? Has the astronomical cost of local housing priced Carmel Valley out of the

Bach Fest offers something for someone who has everything

FOR THE classical music lover who's been to the Met and La Scala, who knows the difference between a viol and a viola, and whose CD collection is the envy of the neighborhood, Carmel Bach Festival managing director Jesse Read has a suggestion — treat yourself to your very own world class musician.

When Read kicked off a new fundraising program two years ago, he figured it would be a challenge to sell the idea. Pairing a specific musician with a particular patron looked good on paper, but how much money would a local resident pay for such a honor? "We knew it would be tough, but we worked real hard at it," Read recalled. To say the sponsorship program succeeded would be an understatement.

"Every single musician is sponsored by a patron," Read explained. "We're talking about nearly 200 musicians. Now they're fighting over the musicians. People love to have a personal association with them. It's a great thing." The typical sponsor is paying a minimum of \$500 to help offset the expenses of a musician. The price varies depending on the musician, and the conductor carries a \$10,000 sponsorship price tag.

"The musicians' housing and travel is no small amount of money," Reade said.

But for the sponsor, the relationship is about more than just money.

"Sponsoring a musician can be a lot of fun," encouraged Read. "Sponsors are able to get to know the musicians in sort of a backstage way. They meet for a cup of coffee or play golf together."

The sponsorship program serves as another bridge in the growing relationship between the city and its adopted Bach Festival musicians.

"They're only here for six weeks, but they cement life-long friendships," Read said. "Many of the musicians bring their families with them each summer. The patrons get to know their kids as they grow up."

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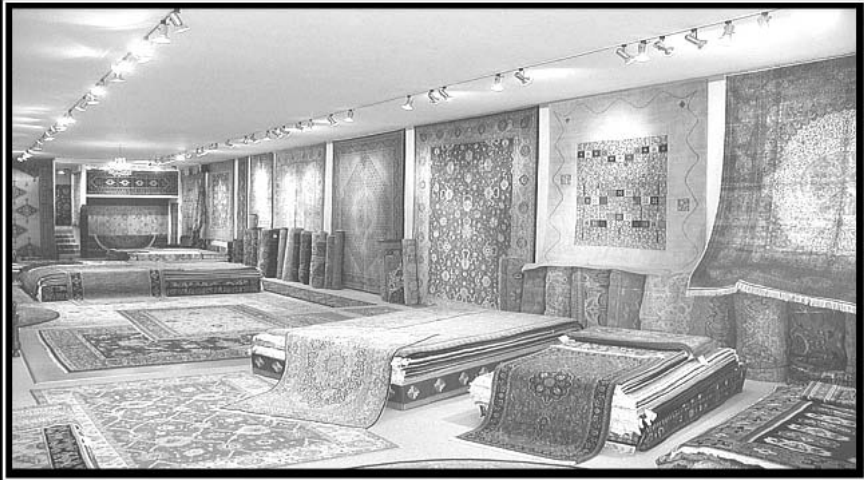


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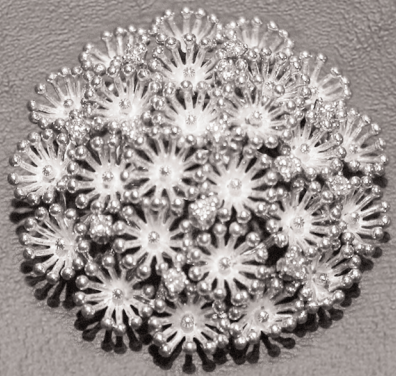
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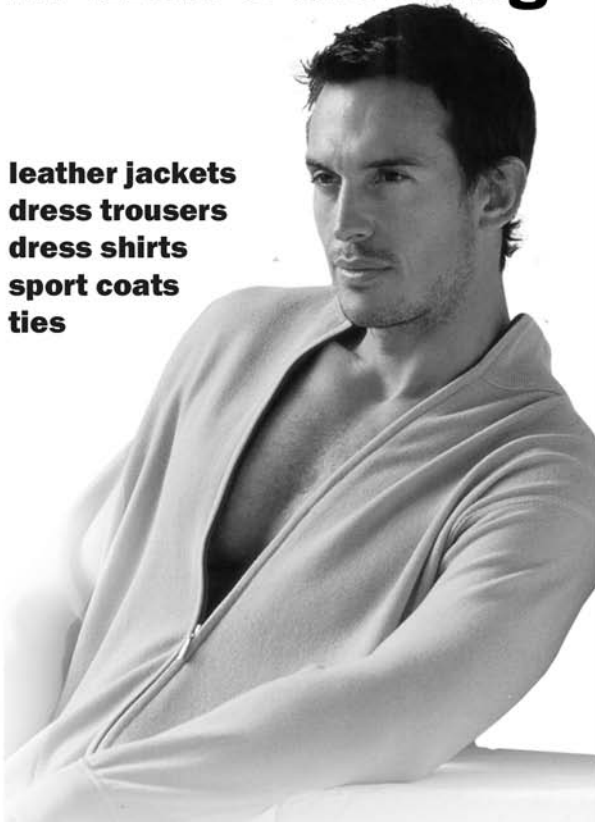
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Judge bounds Hurley over after prelim hearing

IN TESTIMONY that sometimes had the courtroom in stitches, but also highlighted a family trust gone sour, Lillian King, 98, said

last week in a Salinas courtroom she never gave permission to her grand niece to sell her collection of gold and silver coins.

Cindy Hurley, 47, who is being held on \$70,000 bail, is charged with financial elder

abuse, fraud and embezzlement, and is suspected of stealing valuable gold and silver coins and jewelry from King, a wealthy Pacific Grove property owner.

Adorned in clusters of gold bracelets and rings, the colorful and charming King, who said she began collecting gold in 1980 as an investment, said at the June 30 hearing she never intended to get rid of her gold and silver coins.

"The one thing that hurts me most is my mother's diamond pin," King said at Hurley's preliminary hearing about a missing piece of jewelry, just before breaking into tears. "I would give everything to get that back."

King also drew laughter from attorneys and Superior Court Judge Russell Scott as she hesitated giving her age to Scott, stating

she was "over 39" before whispering her true age to him.

"You're a nice judge," she told Scott.

The June 30 preliminary hearing was the first time King has spoken publicly about the alleged theft.

About \$2 million in Krugerrands, gold and silver coins belonging to King are missing, authorities say.

Hurley and King first made news after the Pacific Grove Police Department's SWAT team served a search warrant at King's oceanfront property on Sunset Drive in Pacific Grove in September of last year. Police were looking for drugs, but only found a small amount of marijuana.

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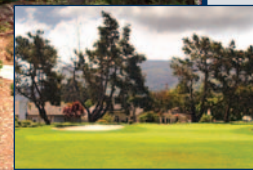
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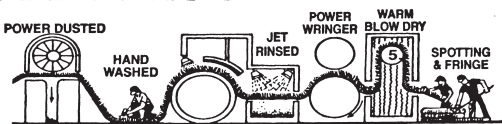

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\$11.75 million budget gives \$35K for more library hours

THE CARMEL City Council unanimously voted June 22 to approve its \$11,749,860 budget for 2006/2007, including a \$100,000 upward projection in revenues over the initial draft and an equal amount in added spending. Over objections from city administrator Rich Guillen, the council allocated \$35,000 to increase library hours. Members also approved \$35,000 for additional tree planting and removal, and \$30,000 more toward remodeling public restrooms at the beach.

The budget calls for spending \$7,074,381 on salaries and benefits, and \$4,575,479 on materials and services. Capital projects were kept low to help offset this year's \$1 million in expenditures.

Hotel, sales and property taxes account for more than 80

percent of city revenues. Guillen said third-quarter figures led him to revise income estimates for the coming year: Sales tax should come in \$50,000 higher at \$2.1 million; building permit fees should bring in \$327,000 — \$30,000 more than originally thought, and parking fees should net \$20,000 more than the \$155,000 predicted earlier.

Few residents spoke at the hearing, though Monte Miller asked for more enforcement of city codes and encouraged adding library hours — the latter echoed by two others.

Reading time for kids

After library director Margaret Pelikan recommended opening the children's library for four hours on Saturdays (it's currently closed weekends and Mondays), councilman Mike Cunningham proposed spending \$35,000 to staff those hours as well as four hours at the main branch on Sundays.

Councilmen Erik Bethel and Gerard Rose supported the idea. "We need to send a message to the community that this is a priority," Rose said.

But Mayor Sue McCloud said statistics should determine when the libraries are open, and councilwoman Paula Hazdovac called for a study.

"We're flying blind here," she said. "I would really like more concrete information."

Guillen said the council should not budget the money until he's studied the matter, which would take at least 30 days. He also complained the library board "basically said, 'Take a hike,'" two years ago when he suggested the city handle the library's accounting to save it about \$16,000 per year. He warned the council against hiring more employees who might later have to be fired if the city discovers it can't afford them.

But the simple majority decided to dedicate \$35,000 to the libraries and let Pelikan and Guillen decide when each branch should be open. Guillen said he would need 90 days to make that determination. After the meeting, he said a consultant will be hired to study the library hours.

Scary bathrooms

While the draft budget included \$25,000 to spruce up the Carmel Beach restrooms at Del Mar, Bethel inquired at an earlier meeting how much more it would cost to remodel them. According to the June 22 staff report, another \$30,200 would pay for five toilets (\$500 each), three sinks (\$300 each), one \$300 urinal, \$10,000 for tile and \$12,500 in labor, plus a 15 percent contingency. Council members agreed to spend the additional money.

"This seems like a no-brainer," Bethel said. "It's a little scary in there."

The council also contemplated earmarking \$70,000 more for tree removal next year, but McCloud said planting and maintenance should also benefit. Ultimately, the council decided \$35,000 could be split between the tasks.

"Trees are an asset for our community, and they are also a liability," Cunningham said.

During the final budget hearing, the council reaffirmed paying \$108,000 to the Monterey County Convention and Visitors Bureau for marketing and public relations. The budget includes increased fines and fees for a wide range of permits, including residential parking. It also funds a few promotions and new positions, including a part-time assistant for community services and another police officer to reduce overtime.

And for the first time in several years, it anticipates putting money away for emergencies.

"We need to start paying our reserves," McCloud said.

The new budget took effect July 1.

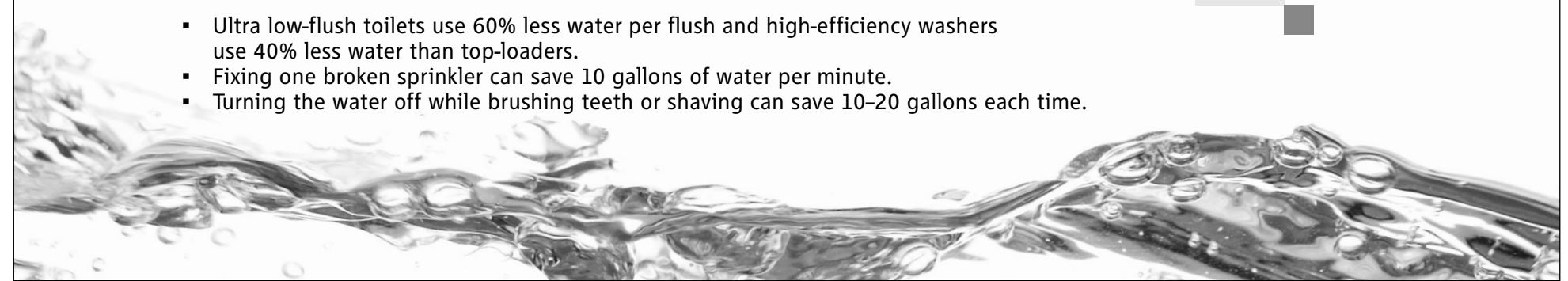

Carmel reads The Pine Cone

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Commissioners put kibosh on business sign designs

AN ART gallery and a hotel can't hang the signs their owners want, the Carmel Planning Commission decided last week, though a garden store can get a new metal sign.

Wood is preferred for business signs, but city rules only require they be constructed of "natural materials," and commissioners approved an unpolished brass sign with hand-cut, stainless steel letters for Aslan's Garden, which is replacing The Garden Shop on Lincoln Street. Agreeing with associate planner Nathan Schmidt's recommendation, they agreed the sign "would not appear lustrous or industrial," and ruled it would fit in well.

But Jeremy Barrett of Dawson Cole Fine Art, who wished to add a wall-mounted sign and four window decals to the gallery at Mission and Ocean, could not celebrate similar

success. The gallery already has a sign on Ocean Avenue but wants a new aluminum sign for its recessed entry. It also wants to add decals with the gallery's name, other locations and the name of sculptor Richard MacDonald's, whose works the gallery sells.

Schmidt advised the commission to reject all the new signs, but Barrett offered a compromise.

"We're willing to get rid of the aluminum sign if we could possibly keep the decals on the windows," he said.

He named several other downtown shops with such stickers, to which commissioner Julie Culver commented, "The city should hire you," and commissioner Robin Wilson chimed in, "We need an enforcement officer."

But chairman Bill Strid wasn't persuaded. He said the city worked hard to limit signs to one per business entrance unless special circumstances exist.

"I think the law works and will continue working," Strid said. The commission unanimously voted to deny Barrett's request.

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The Shops at The Lodge, Pebble Beach

Sweat is good; Sweet is bad

FOLLOWING LAST year's ban on less-than-nutritious food on Carmel campuses, the school board last week passed new rules to promote healthy lifestyles in kids.

The "student wellness" policy passed by the board of education of the Carmel Unified School District requires "a coordinated school health system that supports and reinforces health literacy" through classroom teaching, exercise, health and nutrition services, psychological and counseling services, examples set by faculty and staff, safe and healthy school environments, and parent/guardian and community involvement.

Regarding nutrition, other school policies adopted last year and slightly revised last month already prohibit serving and selling "foods of minimal nutritional value," such as candy and sodas. They also dictate the amount of calories and fat allowed in school meals and drinks.

Meanwhile, the new wellness policy encourages serving fresh fruits and vegetables from school gardens whenever possible, and parents and guardians should provide healthy snacks when donating to parties and special events. They will be "especially dissuaded" from sending junk food in their kids' lunches or for whole classes, while fundraisers should peddle nonfood items or healthy alternatives.

The policy also calls for adequate, sheltered and well-lit places to eat, as well as free, safe drinking water.

The policy adopted June 26 calls for creating comprehensive health education curricula, including lessons on nutrition for all grades. And teachers should "incorporate current, scientifically accurate nutrition content and references into other academic areas."

To ensure kids don't receive mixed messages, school officials will send health information home as well. "Outreach to parents/guardians shall emphasize the relationship between student health and academic performance," according to the new policy.

Sweat is good

Schools will promote moderate to vigorous activity during physical education classes, recess, athletic programs, extracurricular activities, and before- and after-school programs. Teachers will be encouraged to include references to physical education and activity in other academic subjects as well, "to provide additional focus and values on these areas."

Given the emphasis on exercise, board member Amy Funt questioned the logic of requiring high school students to participate in physical education for only two years of their four.

"Don't we want our kids to have regular physical activity in school every day of their school year, every year they're in school?" she asked. "Shouldn't that be our goal?"

Superintendent Marvin Biasotti advised

land trust market?

"I believe there are enough concerned citizens with money willing to put it to a conservation use," Sinotte said. "The Big Sur Land Trust has been very successful buying up large tracts of land."

Glenn Robinson, a proponent of incorporation, disagreed with Sinotte. He believes relying on a land trust to preserve the valley's rural character is just not practical.

"Given the values [of Carmel Valley real estate], will they even be able to make a dent?" Robinson asked. "I doubt it."

Despite his skepticism for Sinotte's idea, Robinson said land trusts can play an important role in a community's conservation efforts.

"My wife and I are members of the Big Sur Land Trust," he said. "We know what it can do and what it can't do."

And what it can't do, Robinson, explained, is make land use decisions.

"Having control over land use decisions is the way to preserve Carmel Valley," he insisted.

Still, Robinson said he would support Sinotte's group.

"I would welcome him to create it," he said. "I'll pledge him \$100 a year."

BSLT looks to the east

The Big Sur Land Trust has remained silent during the incorporation debate, but that hasn't stopped the Carmel-based nonprofit from intensifying its efforts to promote the conservation of land in Carmel Valley.

"The Big Sur Land Trust is neutral on the issue of incorporation," explained Bill Leahy, executive director. "At the

same time, we are committed to and active in the conservation of key natural resources in Carmel Valley, including important oak woodlands and wildlife corridors, sustaining working ranches, and the vision of a restored river. Our method of conservation is community-based, with willing land owners and cooperative community members from all walks of life working together for specific outcomes everyone can support."

Last fall, the land trust unveiled its ambitious Carmel River Parkway project, which aims to connect Jacks Peak County Park, Carmel River State Beach, Palo Corona Regional Park, Pt. Lobos State Reserve and other parklands. If the plan comes to fruition, the mouth of Carmel Valley would serve as a hub for a network of local trails.

More recently, the land trust created a new full-time position, hiring Donna Meyers as its Carmel Valley project director.

"The call for land conservation outcomes from both sides of the incorporation issue points to the important role of conservation in coming years," Meyers said. "Whatever direction the incorporation issue takes, the land trust will be the community partner for specific Carmel Valley land and water conservation projects in the future."

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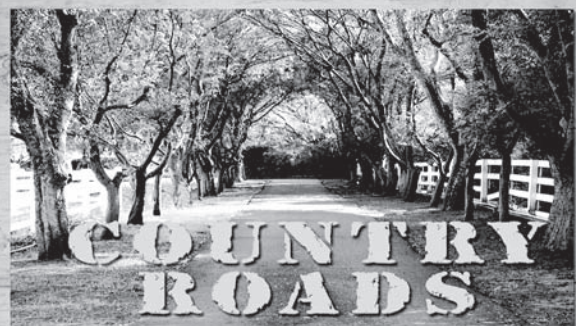

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**EFFECT OF REFINANCING AN OLDER LOAN**

There is one element to a home loan refinancing that most of us don't think about very much. We look at the lower interest rate that's available to us and the resulting lower monthly payment well have to fork over to the lender, and we rejoice that lower interest rates allow us to refinance our existing loan. We can usually even take a bit of money out of the house and invest it in home improvements, a new business, or the education of a child.

If we've been paying a home loan down for quite a few years, though, the effect of refinancing that loan is precisely the same as what would happen if we were buying a new home. The end result is that we have a new 30-year loan, and maybe it won't be entirely to our benefit to tack on another ten years or fifteen years to our payment schedule.

Remember this odd fact about home loan amortization schedules. The way they work mathematically is to front-load the interest portion of the loan, so that we pay far more interest and less toward the principal balance in the first years of the loan and the reverse in the last years. If you're pretty far into paying off your home loan, this is something you may want to consider and your existing loan may gain a certain luster as a result. which ones they want to see. Or, make it a revolving kind of thing."

Ruiz said officials would likely place the 16 framed cartoons on the lobby's west wall, which is currently bare. The lobby is locked after business hours.

"We are going to devote a portion of that one wall to as many as we can put on there," Ruiz said. "We don't know how many that is."

Farr, who wasn't available for comment, issued a prepared statement following Thursday's powwow with the postal service.

"My meeting with representatives from the U.S. Postal Service went well," the congressman said. "I share the view that the local character of the Carmel Post Office is what makes it a unique part of our community."

A postal service "retail standardization team" took down Bates' cartoons to make the interior look more homogenous. Apparently it worked.

"It just looks like an ordinary post office now," said Livingston, who helped organize the drive to get the cartoons back on the walls.

Ruiz said the postal service wants to resolve the matter yet "maintain a good retail environment conducive to doing business."

Carmel Mayor Sue McCloud said Farr called her after his meeting with postal officials.

"I think we all have to be reasonable and come to a solution on this," said McCloud, adding she was happy with the postal service's consideration.

On Wednesday, throngs of Bates supporters congregated outside the post office, soliciting signatures and talking

about the controversy.

Farr's meeting with postal officials about Bates' cartoons, was part of a larger discussion about customer service and maintenance issues at the post office.

Bates' work is so dear to the hearts of Carmelites, that in September 1998, then-Mayor Ken White and the city council presented a certificate to Bates recognizing "his contributions to the community in the field of humor and establishing the Bill Bates Humor Overlay District," a several-foot circle around the artist.

Bates couldn't be reached late Thursday but said Wednesday he's not a bit surprised by the outpouring of support.

"I know how individualistic Carmelites are," he said. "And they want to preserve the bohemian culture of the village by requesting my cartoons go back up on the wall."

Although postal service officials had previously offered to place them back on the post office hallway, Bates said the location would make the illustrations vulnerable to theft.

"It's too dark and security is a problem," he said. "They they could be lifted from the hallway because there is nobody there at night."

Formal Carmel City Councilwoman Barbara Brooks said Wednesday Bates work defines Carmel and its people, often poking fun at the city, but with respect and dignity.

"What's the point of homogenizing our town into everytown U.S.A.," Brooks said, sitting next to "Blossom," her 2-year-old Cavalier King Charles Spaniel.

On Wednesday, upset over the pulled illustrations, an unidentified Bates supporter ripped out a Bates cartoon published in The Pine Cone last week and taped it to a wall in the post office.

The cartoon shows a man and woman looking up at a naked wall in the post office with the caption, "It used to be OUR post office."

But officers did find King living in squalid conditions, with clutter and trash piled high. The multi-acre estate was red-tagged.

Hurley became the subject of a police investigation after 14 boxes of King's silver coins were stolen from a Monterey storage locker in April.

King also filed a restraining order against Hurley, saying Hurley mistreated her.

"Did you ever give permission for Cindy to use the [coins] for any reason?" Monterey County Deputy District Attorney Lisa Poll asked King during the preliminary hearing.

"No," King replied.

Although Hurley didn't testify at the hearing, in an interview with the The Pine Cone, Hurley admitted taking tens of thousands of dollars of coins and selling them in order to pay for property tax on King's rentals in P.G. Hurley also said she loved her aunt and never intended to hurt her.

King, who owns several rental properties in Pacific Grove, allowed Hurley to manage the properties, giving her 30 percent of the income.

"I wanted her to have her some security and learn business," King testified.

When Poll asked if she sold her valuables, King said, "Oh, no. I sure had them stolen from me and that breaks my heart."

Hurley, who Scott reprimanded for trying to prompt King with her answers, also was emotional at the hearing, breaking into tears several times.

Before Hurley will be allowed to post bail, she'll have to prove the money doesn't come from the theft of King's possessions.

Pacific Grove police Sgt. Cameron White testified receipts indicate about \$145,000 in coins, including Krugerrands and pre-1964 silver coins, were sold to coin shops in Carmel and Watsonville.

King moved to the Peninsula in 1954 with her husband, who died in 1988.

Businessman Nader Agha, a friend of King's for 40 years and a former neighbor, told The Pine Cone the Kings purchased coins from him.

"Her husband was the heir from the King family ranch in Texas," Agha said. "They used to sell property and put their income in gold. Gold and silver was their thing. She loves

gold. She and her husband knew what they were doing."

Hurley told The Pine Cone she came from Texas to take care of her aunt, which King refuted at the hearing.

"She never looked after me," King said. "I paddled my own canoe, and I was glad to do it."



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
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Carmel Valley artist uses darkness to illuminate her prints

THE COLOR black is often described as the absence of light. Yet Carmel Valley artist Pamela Takigawa is drawn to the darkest shade in the color palette for its remarkable ability to illuminate a subject.

"There is a velvety quality to the color black in printmaking," said Takigawa, whose work will be displayed in a new exhibit at the Carmel Art Association beginning Saturday, July 8. "I was trying to think of something where I could use black to a good result."

After studying the art of monotone printmaking, Takigawa simply needed a subject that looked good in black. So she turned to the natural world, where she found a compelling form long associated with darkness.

"I've always been fascinated with owls," she explained.

"I've been lucky to see them, even during the day."

The art association will host a festive reception Saturday for Takigawa and two other local artists from 6 to 8 p.m.

Takigawa, who moved to the Monterey Peninsula in 1971, learned printmaking from art classes at UC Santa Cruz and Monterey Peninsula College. Later, after working in the solitude that is so much a part of the creative process, she decided to seek out a little social contact and applied for membership in the art association.

"Artists typically work all by themselves," she explained. "Becoming a member of the art association is a great way to connect with other artists."

Becoming a member of the art association is no sure thing. As Takigawa soon discovered, there are more artists seeking to join the esteemed non-profit than there are membership openings. But the Carmel Valley artist was persistent, a quality she said is essential for any artist. She was finally admitted to the art association in April after her sixth try.

"I am lucky I didn't take it personally,"

she explained. "Art is such a personal thing. If I like what I create, I'm happy. If others like it, it's like putting a cherry on top of it."

Also opening at the art association July 8 are new shows by Julie Brown Smith and Barbara Johnson. An art association member since 1987, Smith uses the sharp contrasts of black and white linocuts, pencil drawings and ink on canvas to illustrate the modern urban world. Johnson, a 30-year Carmel resident, will present a show of abstract relief prints and collage work.

LEDDWARD KAAPANA has been a professional musician for over four decades. His mastery of the slack key guitar and his extraordinary baritone and leo ki'eki'e (falsetto) voice have made him a musical legend in his native Hawaii and beyond. Think pink when it comes to wine

ROSÉ SEASON is officially here. While I like to imbibe in these not quite red, not quite white wines year-round, sun-filled days of (somewhat) warmer weather seem to give us official permission to start drinking this carefree and uncomplicated wine more liberally. In the past, American-made rosés have been less than impressive and for the most part, an underappreciated and decidedly un-chic wine to drink. For many, the mere thought of pink wine conjures up misguided youthful memories of guzzling (gasp) white zinfandel. Increasingly, American winemakers are producing a more serious, dry, crisp rosé that resembles styles found in Spain, Italy and France, and the pinks are among the wine world's fastest rising stars. They are back in fashion and in flavor. When it comes to wine, rosé is the pure essence of summer

and is an exceptional value, because when great winemakers make it, you get a quality product priced much lower than their premium selections. So next time you're surfing the wine shelves in search of the perfect summer refresher, look past the obvious (white wine) and pick something pink.

WHAT IS A ROSÉ?

In French, rosé means 'pink,' and according to Jeff Morgan, author of "Rosé: A Guide to The World's Most Versatile Wine" (Chronicle Books, 2005) and maker of a California rosé called SoloRosa, "We Anglophones have adopted the French word to describe pink wine." Rosé is basically a wine that goes through the red winemaking process, but is stopped before extracting too many red wine characteristics. It is almost always made with red grape varieties, although some winemakers will mix a cer-

tain amount of white grapes with the red. Rosé wines tend to lack the tannic structure of red wines made from the same grape varieties.

BASIC METHOD FOR MAKING ROSÉ

Most rosé is made using a method called saignée (pronounced "sen-yay"), a French word that means "to bleed." After the grapes are picked and crushed, the juice sits in contact with the skins (or macerates) for a short period of time. Since the color of virtually all grapes is in the skins, the length of time until the juice is 'bled' from the skins will determine the hue of the wine—some are barely pink, while others may be confused with a light red wine.

WHEN TO DRINK

Drink rosé during the summer when the wine is refreshingly crisp and fruity. These

wines are best drunk as young as possible—preferably no more than two years after harvest—and served chilled. As for what to pair

with rosé, Dan Tudor, winemaker for Tudor Wines, says summertime dishes are a sure bet. "Pizza, shrimp, light seafood dishes—you know, south of France and Adriatic seafood dishes are perfect," he recommends.

WHAT TO EXPECT

Rosé has the body of a red wine, but the lightness and fruitiness of white wine. "In warmer regions, such as California, riper grapes yield more sugar, lower acidity, and more vivid fruit flavors. As a result, warm-climate rosés tend to be more full-bodied, creamier on the palate, and fruit driven, even when made in a bone-dry style," says Morgan. According to Tudor, "Rosé should taste like a refreshing, light, crisp, white wine." Common aromas and flavors include

just picked raspberries, strawberries and fresh citrus blossoms, and floral notes.

THREE LOCAL ROSÉS TO TRY:

■ Tudor 2005 Monterey County Radog Rosé of Pinot Noir (\$15).

Tudor's 100% pinot noir saignée-style rosé is a totally dry, light-bodied wine with crisp acidity, an enticing blush, and aromas of bright berry with a hint of rose. This elegant wine is produced from grapes grown in Santa Lucia Highlands American Viticultural Area (70%) and Arroyo Seco AVA (30%), barrel fermented in neutral French Oak and pairs well with everything from mushroom dishes to duck.

■ 2005 Lucia Vineyards Lucy Santa Lucia Highlands Pinot Noir Rosé (\$18).

Malolactic fermentation gives this wine more palate weight than an ordinary rosé and allows it to be bottled unfiltered. Sources from grapes grown in the Santa Lucia Highlands AVA (mainly from the Pisoni Vineyard and the Garys' Vineyard) this rosé exhibits dark raspberry color, beautiful wild strawberry and watermelon aromatics, and nice, crisp acidity. Plus, one dollar of every Lucy bottle sold is donated to breast cancer research.

■ Marilyn Remark 2005 Rose De Saignée Monterey County (\$22).

If you can get your hands on this classically Rhône-styled dry pink, buy it. Only 235 cases were produced and this al fresco season favorite sells out quickly. This fruit-forward wine shows concentrated flavors of cranberries, watermelon and strawberries that balance perfectly with bright, food-pairing acidity.

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does not officially begin until Saturday, July 15. But for anyone who would rather not wait that long, the following performances offer a preview of the main event:

■ Sunset Center will host an open rehearsal Friday, July 7, at 10 a.m. Musicians will perform arias and symphonies as they prepare for a Mozart program. The public is asked to arrive by 9:30 a.m. and be sure to turn all cell phones off. Admission is free.

"The rehearsal gives people in the community a chance to see how it's put together," Read explained. "So much creativity happens in a rehearsal. It can be a real dynamic moment and a lot of fun for the musicians."

■ For classical music lovers with young would-be classical music lovers, a "kid-friendly" event is designed to help introduce youngsters to the joys of brass, woodwind and percussion instruments. With the decrease of music programs in

public education, Read believes the Bach Festival's children's events play an important role in the community.

"We all know about the Mozart effect and how much classical music can influence a child's ability to learn," Read said. "It's been proven. And it's not just Mozart. It's Bach, and it's classical music in general. Through classical music, kids learn about the world. They learn about other cultures, they learn about geography, and they learn about history."

The Sunset Center "gym" will host the children's workshop. Admission is free but reservations are required. Call (831) 624-2046 for more information.

■ The Tower Brass and Percussion ensemble will perform a free concert at Carmel Plaza, Saturday, July 8, at 5 p.m. According to Read, the eight-member ensemble was inspired by town pipers from the 18th century. The pipers, who often lived in the towers of town halls and churches, were an important institution in Renaissance Europe. In addition to playing church and dance music, the tower musicians also alerted local residents to the presence of a fire or an invasion.

The tower music tradition has been a part of the Bach festival since its inception. According to Read, Carmel resident Chandler Stewart — who played trumpet and trombone — started the first ensemble with his five sons in the late 1930s.

The present-day ensemble, which features trumpets, trombones, french horns and a percussionist, is composed of Bach festival regulars.

"They form when they come here each year," Read said. "After about 20 minutes they sound like an old group."

■ The Monterey Plaza Hotel and Spa will host "Go for Baroque! Brilliant Strings and Great Singing with a Touch of Jazz" on Sunday, July 9, at 5 p.m. The Monterey Bay Symphony Orchestra will be joined by Bach festival soprano Alice Kirwan Murray and popular local jazz pianist Weber Iago.

"Weber wrote a concertino with an 18th century flavor to it," Read explained. "Weber told me he always wanted to do something for the Bach festival, so I said 'Let's commission a piece.' It turned out to be a great idea."

Despite the obvious differences, Read believes there is much common ground between classical music and jazz.

"People should stop building walls around music," he said. "People who love jazz often love classical music. We're trying to move a little bit more into jazz. This is what we mean when we say 'Bach and Beyond.'"

A wine reception will precede the event at 4:15 p.m. Tickets for the concert are \$25 each.

A little something different

This year's festival will also offer Mexican Baroque concerts at the Carmel Mission on three successive Wednesdays starting July 19. A dinner will precede each show.

"Each year we try to do something different," Read explained. "This year we are featuring 18th century and Baroque music from Mexico and how it came up the Mission Trail to California. It will be a big production, and it will offer some very interesting choral music, both secular and sacred."

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

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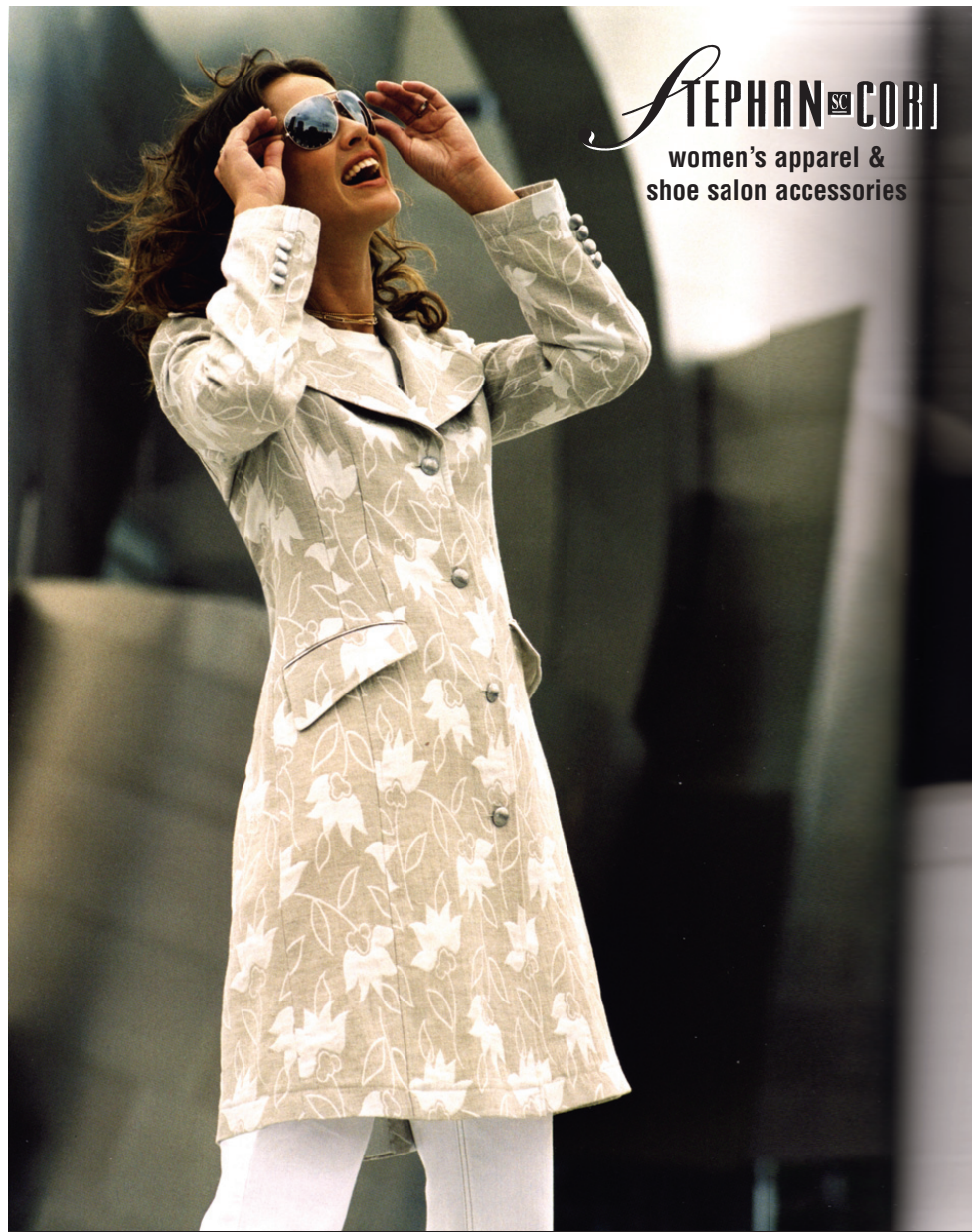

he said. "And he heard the APB go out."

Not long after that, the man heard some loud voices outside.

"He heard a conversation outside his house and it was these [suspects] talking about what they had done," Uretsky said.

So the man called police, who converged on the Del Rey Oaks neighborhood. Officers found the four men, all 18 years old, and arrested them without incident, he said.

"We found them with blood all over them," Uretsky said. "And they had admitted they were involved in that fight."

The alleged assailants, several of whom had recently graduated high school, were intoxicated before the attack, he said.

"The individuals in the truck were kind of yelling obscenities and being loud and rambunctious," Uretsky said.

But the servicemen, who also had been drinking and were walking home, didn't hear exactly what the attackers said.

"And the servicemen said 'how about a ride?'" Uretsky said. They thought they were somebody from NPS or DLI that they knew."

It was at that point, the four men got out of the vehicle and beat the victims, he said.

Two of the victims were transported by ambulance to CHOMP and underwent x-rays and received stitches for wounds. They were released a few hours later. The alleged

attackers had "offensive" injuries including bruised knuckles, Uretsky said.

The events leading to the arrests were a mix of good luck and community involvement.

"It was a combination of good citizens and good police work," he said.

The four men were arrested on suspicion of assault with a deadly weapon and inflicting great bodily injury. They were released after each posted \$25,000 bail, Uretsky said.

In 2000, two Marines brutally attacked a woman on the rec trail, nearly killing her. The two men were sentenced to life in prison for the crime.

But unprovoked attacks are unusual in Pacific Grove.

"The rec trail has had its share of problems, but generally speaking, it's a fairly safe place to be," he said. "This is a situation of being at the wrong place at the wrong time. These people were looking for a fight, and these were the people they came across."

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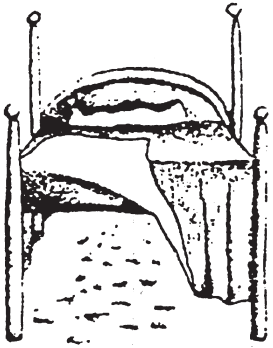

the board would have to change the high school's graduation requirements. Funt acknowledged that fact but said she simply wanted to raise the issue.

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The messages to students don't end with food and exercise. According to the new policy, "students shall be encouraged to recycle; conserve materials, water and energy; use biodegradable materials when possible, and dispose of waste in an environmentally sound way at school, in the cafeteria, in the school garden and kitchen classroom, and in all classroom-based activities."

Without much discussion during its first reading June 12 or its second reading June 26, the board unanimously adopted the new wellness policy, which satisfies a state requirement and fulfills a mandate trustees established a year ago calling for the drafting, approval and implementation of the new rules. A committee of district staff, teachers, nurses, parents, community members, nonprofit representatives and students developed the policy.

They similarly decided against the 2.3-square-foot, metallic gold sign that would have hung under the existing wood one at Ray Patel's Carmel Oaks Inn & Suites on Fifth Avenue and read, "Clarion Collection by Choice Hotels."

Owner Ray Patel offered to have the sign constructed out of wood, though he said he would have to get permission from corporate headquarters. But it would still result in too much square footage for one business, according to the municipal code.

"Given it would total 6 square feet where the code calls for 3 square feet, perhaps you could redesign the original sign to add what it is you want in the second sign," commissioner Ken Talmage suggested.

sion was also applauded by property rights activists, who have long been critical of the state agency for overreaching.

For members of Big Sur's Coast Property Owners Association — who were outraged when a coastal commission planner floated the idea two years ago of requiring new homes to be invisible when viewed from the sea — the ruling was welcome news.

"This would have been a big issue if it sounded like it was going somewhere," said Mike Caplin, president of Big Sur's Coast Property Owners Association. "[5th District Supervisor] Dave Potter called it laughable. Hopefully, now it's a truly dead issue."

According to the ruling, "The legislature has not recognized an ocean boater's 'right to a view' of the coastline as a factor in regulating development. The legislature has given the coastal commission enumerated powers to regulate such development. But the legislature has not empowered the coastal commission to 'add' the factor of a boater's 'right to a view' of the coastline as a factor to deny or restrict development in the coastline zone."

In presenting the coastal commission's case, executive director Peter Douglas argued the property is "obviously a very sensitive site, given its location, remoteness, and undeveloped character."

The appeals court ordered the state agency to rehear the Schneider case, but without considering whether Schneider's house would affect views of the coast from the ocean.

According to the San Luis Obispo Tribune, Douglas will recommend the ruling be appealed to the California State Supreme Court.

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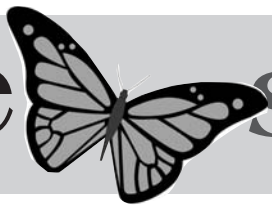

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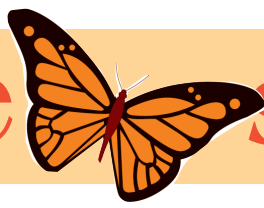

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Editorial

Too many warnings trend goes national

FOR YEARS, Californians have been bombarded with useless warnings about beach contamination and many other supposed hazards. And now, the trend has gone national.

This week, the national news media used nearly funereal tones to report that beach closures due to bacterial pollution are way up in almost every coastal state.

The reports echoed the trend in this state, where beach closures have become so commonplace, the public has become inured to them. And to many other types of dire warnings about their health.

Like the boy who cried wolf, the government puts out so many warnings — about bacteria in the ocean, carcinogens at the supermarket, mold in the basement, terrorists everywhere, etc., etc., etc. — that ordinary citizens are no longer able to determine which risks are real, thereby increasing the danger if a truly hazardous situation arises.

Two years ago, we got the first scientific evidence that some of the warning notices plastered all around us were completely unwarranted.

A professor at Stanford University studied beach closures in Orange County. Officials there follow the same procedures used at most popular beach in the nation: Once a week, they collect a small sample of water from each local beach. The sample is taken to a lab where a chemical reagent is added. The sample is then incubated for 24 hours at 35 degrees celsius. If harmful bacteria are present, the sample turns yellow and the beach is closed until a subsequent test produces a negative result.

The problem with this method, the Stanford study showed, is that bacteria levels in ocean water are highly variable. A rip current can make the water “dangerous” in one spot while, just a few feet away, the water is “safe.” High bacteria levels can last just a few minutes and are highly susceptible to factors such as weather, tides and the wind. By the time a sample is tested and a warning is posted, the “danger” may have passed. Or a truly dangerous situation may arise just after a sample is drawn. Or the sample may be drawn at the only “safe” spot on an otherwise contaminated beach.

Meanwhile, in these parts, despite all the warnings, hardly anybody gets sick swimming at Monterey County beaches, local health officials say.

The Stanford professor who conducted the study said ocean testing has to be done more frequently and results obtained much more quickly for the tests to have any meaning.

In light of the national publicity this week, we would like to repeat our suggestion for Monterey County: Unless there’s been a sewage spill, don’t bother with weekly testing of the water at local beaches. Surely something more productive can be done with the lab time and the tax money currently devoted to a useless pursuit.

dents of the progress we are making toward securing a long-term, drought-proof water supply. I did wish to add further clarification, however, to the nature of our discussions with Poseidon.

As your story correctly states, there is no agreement with Poseidon on our large-scale desalination and aquifer storage and recovery proposal, the Coastal Water Project (CWP). The only thing under discussion with Poseidon is a possible sharing of costs and data for the temporary, "pilot" test-facility. A partnership of this nature would help to reduce costs to California American Water customers, but has no relevance or predetermination on the outcome of the CWP.

We remain consistent in our commitment to build an 11,730 acre-foot project that allows us to address state-ordered pumping restrictions of the Carmel River and the Seaside Basin overdraft. That is our preferred project and what we have asked the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) to review. The CPUC - not

California American Water - has final say on a long term water supply for the Monterey Peninsula. If they choose a regional project instead of our preferred project, a partnership would be more likely given our status as a regulated utility and the fact that we cannot provide water to areas beyond our service territory.

Let me be very clear that we want 11,730 acre feet to comply with State and Federal laws and improve conditions on the Carmel River. We are less concerned with who ultimately owns the desalination plant than we are with obtaining a reliable and long term water supply. Having said that, we are not willing to put our compliance with state and federal laws in the hands of others unless it is proven they can deliver water when we need it, at costs approved by the CPUC. Until that point, we are committed to developing the CWP to completion.
