Bates cartoons get postal reprieve

IT MAY take a few weeks, but a collection of Bill Bates cartoons will again be displayed in the main lobby of the Carmel post office.

Carmel Mayor Sue McCloud said Tuesday postal officials gave her the official news July 7 they would allow at least some of the cartoons to be rehung.

"Carlos Santiago, the postmaster, is on leave for two weeks," McCloud said. "And he knows where they will go." After the sudden removal of the cartoons three weeks ago, news the Bates cartoons will soon be entertaining folks waiting in line to buy stamps drew applause.

"The cartoons individualize our post office," said Barbara Livingston, a former Carmel city councilwoman who campaigned to get the cartoons back on the post office walls.

A government "retail standardization team" from the San Francisco Bay Area removed the Bates' cartoons to homogenize the look of the post office lobby. The postal service said its goal was to "maintain a good environment conducive to doing business."

In a petition drive that exceeded the spirit of most political campaigns, Bates' supporters collected more than 1,000 signatures over two days last week to encourage the postal service to reinstate the cartoons. Congressman Sam Farr met with postal officials to stress the importance of Bates' art to Carmelites.

Before they relented, the feds imposed a condition: Bates must release the post office from liability in case his poster-size cartoons were damaged or stolen.

"So, we prepared a one-paragraph statement and Bill signed it and we mailed it," McCloud said. "Hopefully it was satisfactory."

Bates has been the official cartoonist at The Pine Cone for more than three decades. The drawings displayed at the post office — famous for capturing the Carmel's quirkiness and charm — were published in the newspaper in the 1970s.

Although the details haven't been worked out, Bates said he's been told postal officials will only allow space for about half of the 16 cartoons originally displayed in the lobby. That didn't sit well with some of Bates' supporters.

HOMEOWNERS FACE STIFF FINES FOR ILLEGAL DEMOLITIONS

TWO PACIFIC Grove homeowners who "demolished" their historic houses have been slapped with hefty fines approaching \$140,000, penalties rarely imposed by the city.

Planning officials determined a 1916 home on 13th Street and a 1908 home on Spruce Avenue were altered beyond what was permitted for structures listed on the city's historic resources inventory.

"It's always a loss every time you [destroy] one of these buildings; they are irreplaceable resources," said Barbara Nelson, Pacific Grove's senior planner.

Martin and Janet McCarthy, who own the 13th Street house, were fined \$90,150 while Thomas Schellenberg, owner of the Spruce Street house, must pay \$47,710.

But David Sweigert, attorney for the McCarthys, said he doesn't believe his clients violated the rules.

"We believe that all of the work that has

taken place up until the violation [notice] is completely consistent with the approval of this project and consistent with the building permit issued for this project by the city," Sweigert said.

Schellenberg couldn't be reached for comment.

The P.G. historic inventory is a list of structures built prior to 1927 that retain their original character and architectural style. Homes on the list are subjected to restrictive rules.

Although both homeowners had permits to modify their houses, the work done "exceeded the scope of what was approved," Nelson said.

Spruce Street home just a shell

In a July 3 report, Jon Biggs, the city's community development director, said a building inspector noticed demolition of the exterior walls of the historic home on Spruce

City council decides not to alter live music ordinance

CARMEL'S LIVE music ordinance won't be altered in order to clarify whether outdoor performances are permitted under the law, the city council decided Tuesday.

The city council voted to adopt a live music ordinance in September which overturned a 1939 ban on live music in town wherever alcohol is being served.

"We have been getting complaints of live music being played outside," Mayor Sue McCloud told The Pine Cone

before the meeting.

The council brought up the issue Tuesday to clear up ambiguity in the ordinance, which contains strict rules about how loud music can be, but doesn't specify whether live music is allowed outdoors in some parts of the city.

But the council took the advice of city attorney Donald Freeman, who said the ordinance should remain as is to allow flexibility in interpretation.

In the city's residential/commercial district, the ordinance uses "yard," indicating live music outdoors is acceptable.

But in the city's two other districts, the language in the ordinance is less clear and hinges on the interpretation of the words "property," "premises," and "facility."

In order for live musicians to play in bars and restaurants downtown and in outlying hotels, business owners must obtain a permit from the city.

The law requires each applicant to submit a noise management plan identifying all "noise-sensitive uses" within 200 feet, such as homes and libraries, and determine how to keep noise levels below 45-55 decibels, depending on the location of the business.

Since the ordinance was passed last year, the city's planning commission has issued five use permits authorizing live music. But two of the permits — Forge in the Forest and Cypress Inn — allow outdoor music.

"The planning commission issued permits allowing outdoor music on the belief that the venue is immaterial," Brian Roseth, the city's principal planner, noted in a staff report to the council.

The decibel levels specified in the ordinance control the potential impact of noise-sensitive areas, nearby businesses and pedestrians regardless of where music is played, Roseth said.

Monta Potter, chief executive officer for the city's chamber of commerce, told council members the city should allow live music outdoors. She also reminded them there was a 10 p.m. curfew for live music.

If a business approved for live music has a history of complaints or problems, the city can pull the permit, Roseth said.

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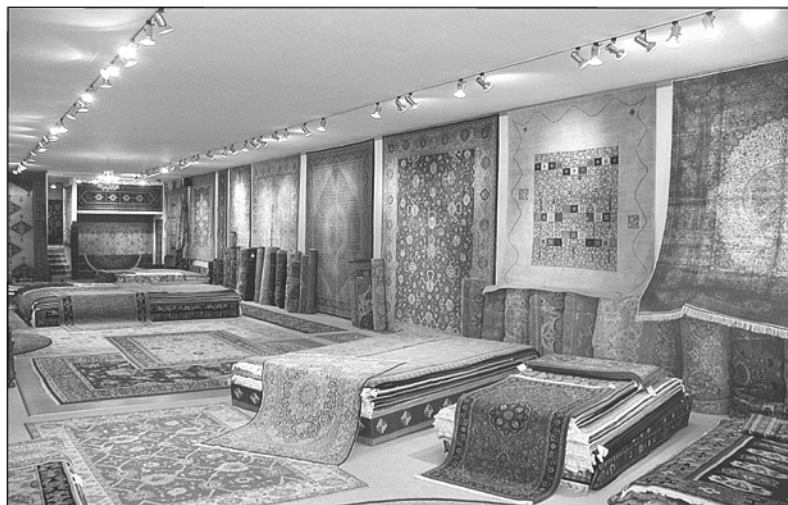


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David Herman Spilfogel

David was a spiritual person who followed both his Jewish faith and his own personal philosophy of thought and meditation. He always made people smile and laugh with his unique personality and disarming sense of humor.

David's fight against cancer demonstrated the incredible character with which he led his life. Although he suffered through the pain of surgery, radiation, and chemotherapy he never complained and continued to express concern for his friends and family. In many ways his disease made him an even stronger individual. He once wrote, "Cancer is a feared experience...a bad thing gone good. Remember to have fun, and to make friends, it is for your own health. Tomorrow when you wake up, do what I do; ask yourself, what is really important, and who could I love today?"

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Council reverses historic board on old barn, home

THE CARMEL City Council voted Tuesday to remove two homes from the city's Inventory of Historic Resources, overturning decisions by the Historic Resources Board earlier this year.

The council's decision is the latest in Carmel's historic home saga after the city last summer informed 300 property owners their buildings were "historic" and would have restrictions attached to their deeds.

A Carpenter Street home used as a barn in 1898 and a San Antonio Road house designed by Jon Konigshofer in 1941 were the latest to be removed from the historic list.

"I don't see this as a particularly important structure," councilwoman Paula Hazdovac said of the Konigshofer home.

The "early Modernist" home built in the "Second Bay Area Tradition" is part of the five-building complex called Sand and Sea, which the city considers an historic district.

But Meta Bunse, a consultant working for property owner Alfred Johnson, said the house has an "unremarkable design" and should not be considered historic, especially since the home has been altered.

"The building is not an important example of a designer-builder," Bunse said. "And he is not considered by his peers as being recognized as great in his field."

Johnson's home had been placed on the city's Inventory of Historic Resources that was adopted as part of the Local Coastal Program in 2004. He appealed the designation, but city staff recommended denial of his appeal and in February, HRB members unanimously agreed with staff. But the majority on the council decided Johnson's home was not historically significant; only councilman Michael Cunningham voted to keep the home on the historic list. He argued that even though Konigshofer doesn't have the reputation of a master such as Frank Lloyd Wright, he was prolific, designing 150

homes in the area.

"The notoriety is not as important as the quality of work in the aesthetic sense," Cunningham said.

Turn-of-the-century barn not historic

The council also voted to remove a Carpenter Street home, affectionately called "the barn," from the inventory. The HRB had denied an appeal by the property owner in March even though city staff had recommended granting her appeal.

The barn, built in 1898 and converted to a house in 1937, had been altered too much over the years and had lost its original character, the council determined.

"It has lost its integrity," Cunningham said. "It's a charming home, but not a barn." This is no doubt a relief to the woman who lives in it.

Bunse, also a consultant for owner Doreen Silva, said the structure had been considerably compromised over the years, preventing any real connection to its agricultural history.

"This building, unlike barns, has a bathroom, kitchen, skylight, chimney, residential doors," Bunse said. "It has mechanical heating and air. The skylights are visible from the front of the house. It has a garage too. These are all non-barn things."

The building is also absent a hay loft, stalls or anything else resembling a barn.

Hazdovac said the building should be delisted because its integrity is so far removed from its original use and it has been a residence longer than it was a barn.

A barn that has no hayloft or anything else resembling a barn

State parks completes \$17M acquisition of Pt. Lobos Ranch

■ But hikers will have to wait awhile

IN A move that could one day open up a bounty of hiking possibilities for local outdoor enthusiasts, the Big Sur Land Trust transferred 818 acres of the former Point Lobos Ranch to California Department of Parks and Recreation June 29.

"State parks is thrilled to have such a significant area along the Monterey's coast, and so close to Point Lobos State Reserve, which is one of the gems of the 278 state parks in California," said Mat Fuzie, state parks superintendent for the Monterey district.

The deal represents the final phase of transferring the 1,312-acre ranch to public ownership. State parks acquired 494 acres of the ranch from the BSLT in 1998. According to state parks spokesman Dave Schaechtele,

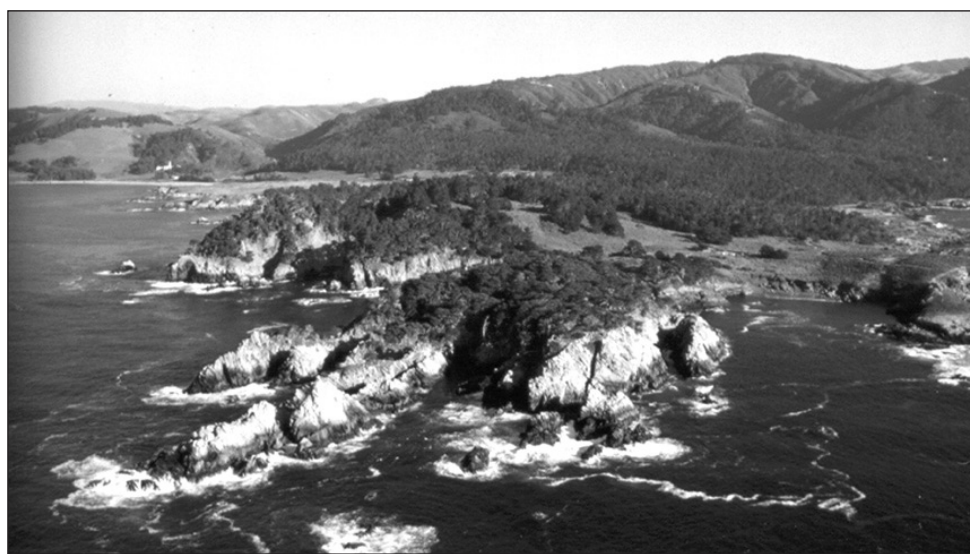
the total purchase price for the ranch was \$17,367,649.

After developers floated proposals for a conference center and a condominium complex, the land trust took possession of the property in 1993 in a complex transaction that required the David and Lucille Packard Foundation to guarantee the deal's financing. Ultimately, taxpayer dollars raised through the Proposition 117 Wildlife Protection Initiative paid for the ranch.

The transaction represents the latest collaboration between the non-profit land trust and a government agency.

"The creation of this park is a great example of a public-private partnership," said Susanna Danner, BSLT conservation project manager. "Through a collaborative project, state parks and the land trust were able to protect creeks and natural areas that will enhance our community's enjoyment of

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Deadline passes without state review of C.V. incorporation fiscal study

THE DEADLINE passed July 9 for Carmel Valley incorporation opponents to file a formal challenge to a fiscal study supporting the proposed town. The challenge would have cost opponents at least \$25,000.

What that move — or in this case, the lack of a move — means is the subject of debate. Opponent Bob Sinotte claims the study is unnecessary. But proponent Glenn Robinson says that by not exercising the option, opponents are conceding the data would stand up to even a strict challenge by state officials.

Robinson said he is surprised the deadline passed without action by opponents. And he also said he's disappointed.

"After promising to challenge the financial study, Mr.

Sinotte apparently woke up to the fact that the study is extremely well done and would stand up to any technical scrutiny," Robinson said. "I had written to Mr. Sinotte encouraging him to challenge the [fiscal data], knowing that the state's stamp of approval would only give greater credence and credibility to this detailed analysis. I suppose he knew this, too, which is why he backed off his pledge."

Robinson said the fiscal study unequivocally endorses the economic viability of the proposed town.

"Three detailed and sophisticated financial analyses have

all confirmed what common sense tells us: That Carmel Valley is an affluent community with a rich and diverse tax base that can easily afford to incorporate," he said.

From the start, the economic viability of the proposed town has been the subject of controversy. Early projections indicated the town would have a \$2.2 million surplus by its second year of operation, but Monterey County would lose \$2.5 million the same year as a result of the incorporation. A state revenue neutrality law requires a newly formed city or town to compensate its county government for revenues lost as a result of incorporation.

If the county were to insist on receiving the full \$2.5 million "alimony payment" each year, opponents claimed, the town would have an \$300,000 budget deficit in its second

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Adrenaline rushes routine at Red Bull U.S. Grand Prix

‘KENTUCKY KID’ Nicky Hayden won the first international grand prix motorcycle race of his career during the inaugural Red Bull U.S. Grand Prix at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca last year. He returns July 21-23 with another win under his belt and a healthy points lead in the premier contest of a sport that’s globally huge but gets precious little attention in the mainstream American media.

But race fans know all about MotoGP, and Laguna Seca is ready. Honda’s Hayden and fellow Americans Colin Edwards (“The Texas Tornado,” who crashed his Yamaha in a no-holds-barred, last-lap fight for the win with Hayden at Assen, The Netherlands, last month), Kenny Roberts Jr. and John Hopkins will compete with the best racers from a host of other countries in their only race on home soil.

According to track general manager Gill Campbell, organizers are prepared — much

more so than in 2005, when the races were the first in the track’s half-century of operations to sell out — for huge crowds.

“Right now, it feels as if the event is happening this weekend,” Campbell said July 3 as she and her coworkers prepared for the final push, including working Independence Day, to prepare for racers’ arrival the week of July 17.

The July 21-23 USGP will include not only MotoGP, but the very popular American Motorcyclists Association national championship superbike races and three support classes, making for a jam-packed schedule and a jam-packed racing paddock.

“We didn’t have room on the schedule last year to do all four classes, and the only problem we’re having now is trying to fit everyone into the paddock, because it’s a lot of bikes,” she said. “There should be no lack of good racing.”

Ticket sales are brisk, though more people are buying single-day tickets, possibly

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because room rates are too high for them to stay all weekend, according to Campbell. (In a fun twist beginning this week, people who phone and are placed on hold will hear Edwards’ voice asking them to wait, Campbell said, and Hayden recorded radio ads for the USGP from the racetrack at Assen.)

Off the track, Campbell hopes to soon announce post-race entertainment, which will keep spectators from making a mass exodus Saturday and Sunday evenings

“If I can pull it off, it will be a really neat deal for the fans,” Campbell said of the lineup. “So we still have some things up our sleeves.”

Volunteer groups can cash in

Campbell said she needs more volunteer help all weekend.

“For this event, we truly can’t have enough,” she said. “We still have opportunities for groups to raise funds.”

The only nonprofit racetrack in the country, Laguna Seca counts on volunteers to check tickets, staff concessions stands, ferry spectators from one side of the track to the other, sell programs and handle other tasks. Nonprofits provide the workers and receive grants in return when the Sports Car Racing Association of the Monterey Peninsula, which operates Laguna, settles its books in the fall.

“We’re looking for organizations to sign up,” Campbell said.

Major safety improvements, including widening runoff room in several corners by moving hillsides and walls, took place this

widening runoff room in several corners by moving hillsides and walls, took place this spring, and the racetrack was resurfaced. Crews demolished the old media center above Turn 1 to cut back the hillside and construct a hospitality area, which is expected to be completed this week.

But everyone plans to work nonstop for the next few weeks, Campbell said, to set up tents and bring in office trailers — 81, to be exact — as well as motor homes and shower trailers to accommodate the racing teams. Generators must be brought in to power them, and extensive high-speed and wireless communications systems will soon come online.

“Every office must have wireless capabilities, closed-circuit television cabling — all that kind of stuff,” Campbell said.

No more headaches

The planning for the 2006 races began as soon as last year’s event ended. To appease spectators who went hungry or thirsty stand-

ing in lines at a mere nine concession stands last year, and who waited hours to buy T-shirts and posters, the July 21-23 races will feature 54 food and drink stands, and an 8,000-square-foot souvenir superstore. Clogged pedestrian bridges over start-finish and between turns 3 and 4 will be relieved when officials allow pedestrians to cross the track at specific times.

To ease traffic snarls, only motorcycle-riding ticket holders — with an entrance all their own — and VIPs with parking credentials can drive personal vehicles to the track. Everybody else will park at California State University Monterey Bay and take shuttle buses to and from the races. In addition, Monterey-Salinas Transit will offer free bus service to ticket holders on dedicated routes from Carmel, Monterey, Seaside and Salinas.

“I know a lot more what to expect this year,” Campbell said. Last year, “we went into a lot of things relatively blind.”

LUAC to weigh in on SUV driving school

NEARLY A year after launching an off-road driving school in Carmel Valley, Quail Lodge is seeking a permit for the school from the Monterey County planning department.

The Carmel Valley Land Use Advisory Committee will weigh in on the proposal at its next meeting, Monday, July 17, at St. Phillips Lutheran Church.

In addition to seeking approval to keep operating the school, Quail Lodge is proposing to construct a 15,396-square-foot "cart barn," add 134 new parking spaces and adjust the boundaries of three existing properties.

The move to ask for an official endorsement of the driving school comes after the Monterey County Planning Commission voted 10-1 Feb. 22 to require Quail Lodge to obtain a use permit for the school, which county code enforcement officer Cami Pelletier termed a "commercial venture."

At the hearing, attorney Tony Lombardo, representing Quail Lodge, argued the driving school was a low-impact activity on existing roads, posed no risk to the environment and should not be subject to a use permit.

The planning commission, though, sided with Pelletier. "I think it would be a stretch to not require a use permit," said planning commissioner Jay Brown.

The driving school utilizes five Land Rover SUVs and has one full-time employee. Quail Lodge guests are offered one-hour driving lessons on a network of private dirt roads and are accompanied by an instructor at all times.

Land Rover also operates a driving school at the Biltmore Resort in Asheville, North Carolina and the Fairmont Resort in Quebec, both five-star hotels. Lombardo said neither business is required by its local government to have a use permit.

St. Phillips Lutheran Church is located at 8065 Carmel Valley Road, across from All Saints Episcopal Day School. The LUAC meeting starts at 6:30 p.m.

year.

In May, though, after 18 months at the bargaining table, county officials and proponents reached an agreement on a revenue neutrality settlement which allowed the proposed town to pay off 10 years of lost county revenues (\$15,919,280) in 16 years. Opponent Melvin Steckler called the deal a "gift" for proponents. With the agreement, county officials endorsed the economic viability of the proposed town, leading opponents to consider funding a state review of the data.

Sinotte defended the decision by opponents to let the deadline for the review pass.

"We feel the fiscal analysis was flawed, its numbers are stale and it needs updating," Sinotte said. "But we didn't feel we needed to spend the money."

Steckler elaborated on Sinotte's comments.

"I have studied the fiscal analysis in great detail and concluded the state controller would, in all probability, rubber stamp the review," Steckler explained. "A review would have no real value. It would not be an independent review."

Second Cosby show added

THE GOLDEN State Theater in Monterey will host two performances by comedian Bill Cosby Friday, July 14. One of America's most popular entertainers, Cosby is known for his wit and warmth both onstage and off. 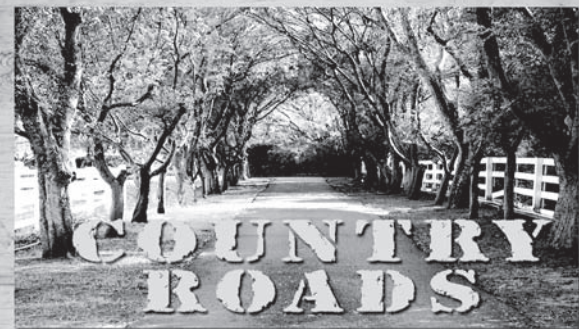

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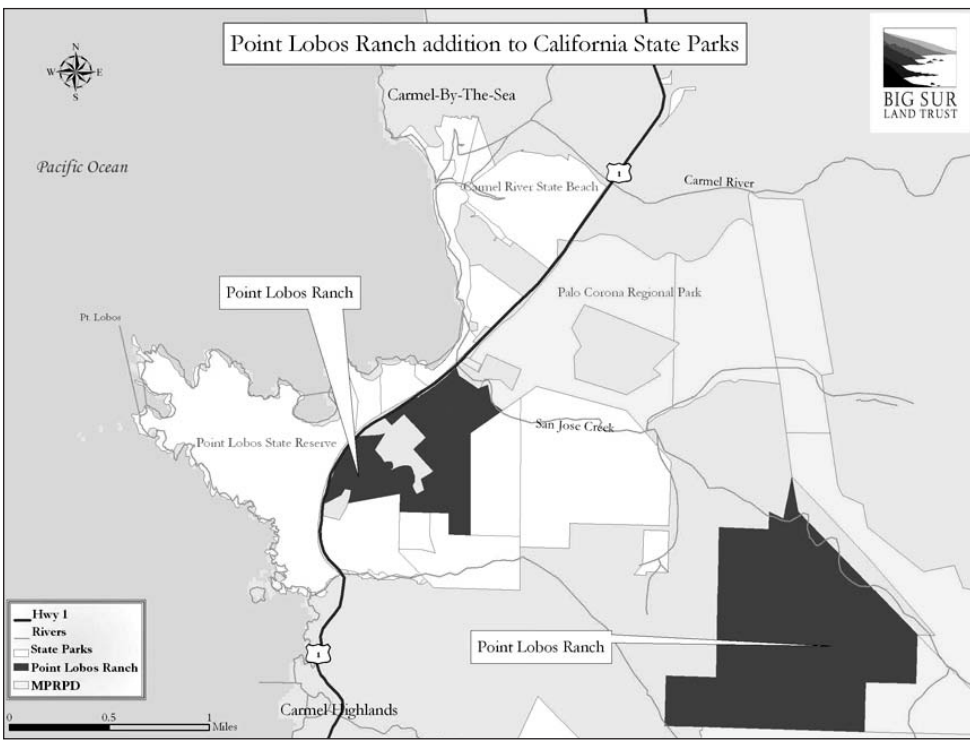

Point Lobos. The watersheds protected within Point Lobos Ranch provide clean water to both Point Lobos Reserve and the Point Lobos Marine Reserve.”

Hikers will have to wait

It is unlikely local outdoor enthusiasts will have an opportunity to explore the heavily forested property any time soon. According to Schaechtele, before public access is approved, an access plan will need to be developed, an environmental impact report will likely need to be completed, and the California Coastal Commission and the Monterey County Planning Department will need to endorse the project. Also, a formal trail system does not presently exist.

“There is no timetable,” said Schaechtele. “All of these things will take time.”

Offering spectacular views of Carmel Bay and the Pacific Ocean coastline, ranch is home to one of the world’s largest native Monterey pine forests as well as groves of redwoods and rare Gowen cypress. About 2.5 miles of San Jose Creek — which provides spawning opportunities for endangered

steelhead trout — passes through the property.

The property also contains significant Native American archaeological sites and historic buildings that were used more than a century ago by whalers and fishermen who docked at Point Lobos. The first buildings actually used whale bones for foundations.

Before the first Chinese whalers arrived at Point Lobos in about 1851, a Native American people known to archaeologists as the Rumsen inhabited the property. They had all but disappeared by the time the fishing industry was established at Whalers Cove, but bedrock mortars once used for grinding acorns remain as evidence of their existence.

In 1898, a racetrack builder and coal miner named Alexander Allan purchased Point Lobos and much of its surrounding land from the Carmel Land and Coal Company, which planned to subdivide the property. Allan, who partnered with Japanese abalone fishermen in a commercial diving venture, began charging admission to Point Lobos, which soon became a popular tourist attraction. The State of California purchased 348 acres from Allan’s heirs in 1933, creating a reserve that would one day become one of the most popular state parks in the U.S.

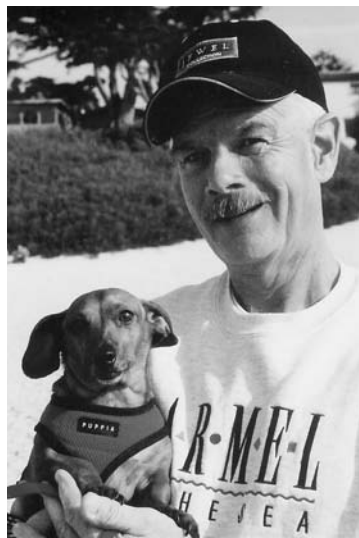

Urban poets descend on Big Sur for regional slam

WHEN CONTROVERSIAL writer Henry Miller lived in Big Sur a half century ago, poets were a rather subdued bunch. Donning berets, they huddled in the shady corners of outdoor cafes, their hushed words harmonizing with the sounds of nature.

Poetry in Big Sur has come a long way. For two days beginning Saturday, July 15, Big Sur's Henry Miller Library hosts the ninth annual West Coast Championship Poetry Slam, an event that is anything but subdued.

Teams of poets compete for bragging rights and the chance to advance to a national event which is essentially the Super Bowl of poetry slams.

The poets have far more in common with contemporary hip-hop artists than with the Bohemian wordsmiths of Miller's heyday. The volume is loud, and the subjects often reflect the anger and angst of youthful poets reacting to the pressures of an urban America that seems to be exploding at its seams.

It's hard to imagine a place more serene and bucolic than the Henry Miller Library garden, with its adjacent redwood grove that forms a natural amphitheater. It seems a more likely setting for a barefoot folksinger or a plein aire painter than a verbal jousting match. The mood is typically laid-back, providing a sharp contrast to the intensity of a poetry slam.

"The contrast [between Big Sur and an urban area] is so great," explained event founder and producer Garland Thompson. "In Berkeley or Oakland, you step out the door of a coffee shop and you're hit by traffic and smog and everything the poets are complaining about."

The lack of inner city distractions "helps bring out what the poets are saying," Thompson said. "The audience is less stressed out and more open to listening to the words."

What would Henry think?

So how would Miller, who passed away in 1980, react to this modern update of one of humanity's oldest literary forms?

"I think Henry would have loved the energy these kids express," said Magnus Toren, library director. "There's a sense of drama unlike anything I've experienced anywhere. Some of these poets are so compelling and entertaining."

Perhaps even more entertaining is event host Jerry Quickly.

"He is one powerful man," Toren said. "He's been an Iraq War correspondent; he's a Def Jam poet, a writer, a performance artist, an incredible rapper and an all-around interesting guy. He's great to watch when he gets the audience going."

Last year's winner was a team from Albuquerque. Underdogs from the start, the New Mexico poets not only took home the top prize in Big Sur, but they went on to win the national event, serendipitously hosted by their home town.

"It was a big surprise," Thompson said. "They were a very young team. Nobody except their coach had even competed out-of-state before."

The Cinderella victory, however, wasn't without controversy. Poets, ever adept at expressing themselves, cried foul over the winner's alleged home court advantage.

Because Big Sur is in the middle of nowhere, it doesn't risk that problem — a fact that appealed to Thompson when he first approached Toren about hosting the event.

"Big Sur is neutral territory," Thompson said. "It's a strange but beautiful place. It takes the poets out of their comfort zone."

After nearly a decade of poetry slams, the Big Sur event has taken on an almost mythical status among poets.

"The event has become almost a right of passage for poets," Thompson said. "It has a real transformative effect on both the poets and the audience."

The competition begins at noon on Saturday and Sunday. The library is on Highway 1, about a quarter-mile south of the landmark Nepenthe restaurant, and about 30 miles south of Carmel. The gates open at noon.

marchese's 400-acre vineyards on Atlas Peak, takes four lucky employees each year to Florence, Italy, to experience the Italian wine harvest — and still makes all the sauces and pastas for Little Napoli from family recipes. He works the line or the front of the house in his restaurant "when someone doesn't show up." Indefatigable is a good description of the man.

He has been married since 1986 to wife Sandra, a local girl of Scottish descent who has handled the books for the restaurants since their inception, and mother of his two sons, Christian, 17, and Gianantonio, 15.

Dinner table as center of the universe

When he was growing up in Hoboken, Pèpe learned the trade in an uncle's bakery. He was immersed in his all-Italian family where "life revolved around the dinner table." His parents were first-generation Americans; his grandparents were from a little town just outside

Naples and emigrated to America through Ellis Island.

When he was 19 he decided to move to Italy and become a baker. He did this for a time, but working in Italy was illegal for a foreigner, and so reluctantly he came home. He elected to start life over at age 21 in California where

there was sun, sea and beautiful women just as there had been in Naples.

Pèpe worked in San Francisco for a year, then made his way to Carmel-by-the-Sea

where he was employed by Wishart's Bakery on Ocean Avenue. He worked at Granary in Pacific Grove as a baker when it was "a hippy natural food market. I was one of the hippies — I had hair down to here," he said, indicating his shoulder. He owned Grinbin Breads, which he later sold to Oroweat. And then in 1986 he bought Wishart's, renaming it Carmel Bakery and Coffee Company two years later.

A small, narrow restaurant just down the

street on Ocean Avenue with a capacity of only 32 patrons became available in 1990. "I thought back to my grandparents. I could make it a family place to eat — where friends could meet. It wasn't intended as a fancy restaurant," Pèpe said. And so he bought that, too, naming it Cafe Napoli.

"You should have seen me then," he said. "Stirring tomato sauce on the restaurant

DON'T BE surprised if one day "The Rich Pèpe Story" appears as a feature film on your TV screen. Pèpe's rise from humble beginnings as a baker in Hoboken, New Jersey, to Carmel-by-the-Sea restaurateur and partner with one of the most renowned vintners in all Italy is a movie plot waiting to be written.

Pèpe is the chef/owner of Little Napoli Bistro Italiano on Dolores near Seventh Avenue and is creative partner with Marchese Piero Antinori in Pèppoli at Pebble Beach — billed

as "a world-class Italian restaurant." He owns the old Wishart's Bakery — now Carmel Bakery and Coffee Co. — and Napoli Napoli coffee house, both on Ocean Avenue.

As an adjunct to these culinary enterprises, Pèpe presents cooking demos at Monterey's Whole Foods Market every month, answers questions about Italy on his online "Ask Mr. Italy" website, writes a monthly column for a local newspaper, conducts annual tours abroad to Tuscan vineyards, treats his restaurant workers to trips to the Napa Valley to visit the

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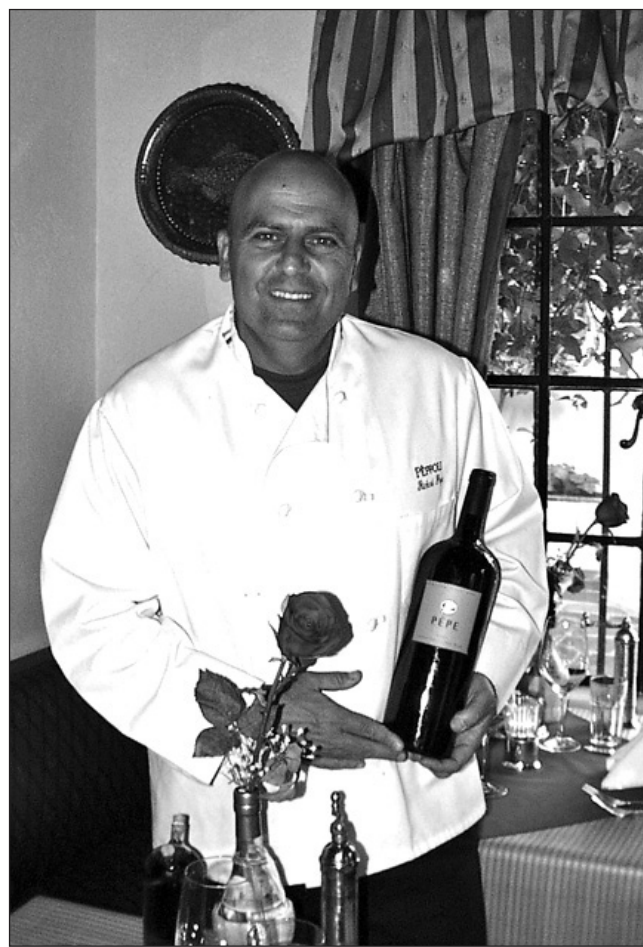

stove, talking to my Aunt Mary on the phone, asking, 'How do you make eggplant Parmigiana?' I'd telephone my mom and ask her 'How do you make meatballs and spaghetti?'
 "I hired a couple of servers who said, 'Why don't we put flowers on the tables? Why don't we get better glasses?' Even the customers made suggestions. I guess you could say we grew organically."
 Italian flags and huge, framed paintings or photographs of Italian scenes adorned the walls; diners sat almost shoulder to shoulder on banquettes before small tables. Customers were jostled by servers squeezing by in the narrow aisle. Recorded Italian music played in the background. It was fun; it was noisy; it was oh, so Italian. Customers loved it.
 Cafe Napoli had a very successful run of almost 15 years

until a year ago when the lease ran out.
 Although he was sorry to close Cafe Napoli, and his regular customers mourned the loss, they all came over to Little Napoli on Dolores Street, which Pèpe had run concurrently with Cafe Napoli for 10 years.
 "Losing the lease was the best thing that ever happened to me," he said. "No more running between the two restaurants. Everything, including my customers, was now at Little Napoli. I could concentrate on that."
 "We still do Grandma's cooking here," he said. "In effect, we're paying homage to Grandma."
 The interior of Little Napoli recently was brightened with new paint, sumptuous window treatments, beautiful new dinnerware by Valvro from Villeroy and Boch, hammered flatware and Reidel glassware.

The baker and the aristocrat

In 2000 he became fast friends and joined forces with Marchese Antinori, perhaps the most famous vintner in Italy and cappelletti famiglia of a 600-year-old aristocratic Florentine family.

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

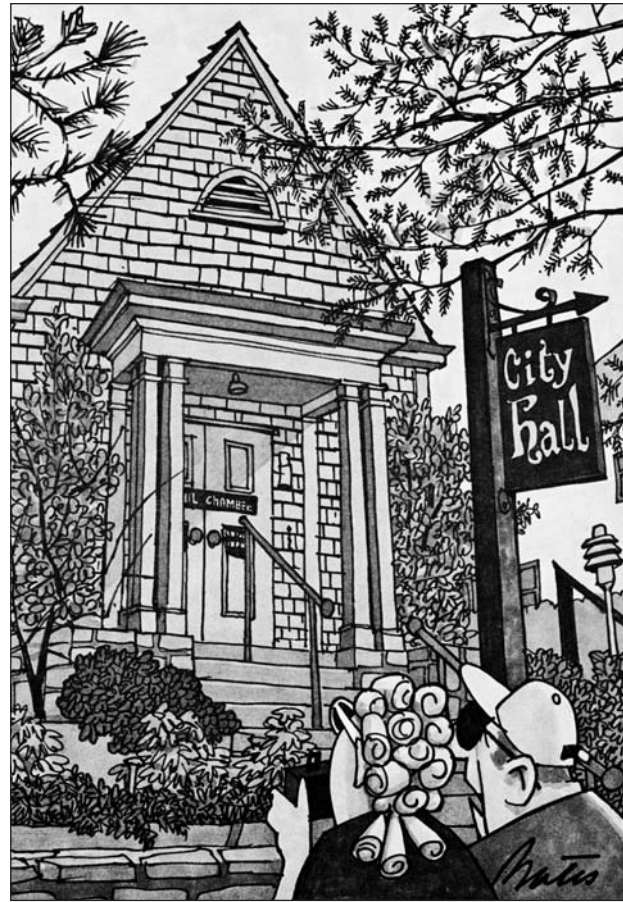
“My position is that the entire west wall of the post office should be given over to the cartoons,” Livingston said. “Spotting them here and there loses the impact of a larger group.”

Roberta Miller, another fan of the cartoonist who helped distribute the petitions, agreed.

But McCloud said even if only some of the cartoons go back up, Bates could rotate them for variety. Bates said he’s not sure if he would do that.

The petition drive last week drew throngs of Bates supporters and onlookers who crowded the sidewalk outside the post office.

This Bates cartoon, first published in The Pine Cone in 1974, is one of the ones likely to be restored to the post office walls. The caption reads, “I hear they run it just like a town. They have a mayor and everything!”

Street "appeared to be beyond the limits of the approved permit and plans." In addition, the foundation, flooring and roof had been demolished, according to the report.

"These materials were discarded before staff had an opportunity to inventory and evaluate them for restoration potential," Biggs said.

All that remains of the Spruce house is a shell of the front portion, the report indicates.

The city issued a stop-work order in February.

According to the city, demolition means

"an act or process which destroys a building or major portion of a building, or impairs its structural integrity."

Only the floor is left

The changes made to the 13th Street home were also drastic, leaving little evidence of the original structure Nelson said.

"The only remaining portion of the building is the floor system," Nelson said. "All you basically see is the platform. All of the walls have been cut and removed."

According to city records, the home had character-defining features including horizontal siding on the exterior, a gabled roof with composition shingles, and ornamental wood trim.

In April, a building inspector noticed the

exterior and interior walls had been removed, leaving only the foundation and the sub floor.

Although the McCarthys still had some wall segments, Biggs in his report noted "their usefulness in any attempt to restore the building is questionable."

Sweigert said the McCarthys will likely appeal the city's decision.

Huge fines rare

Nelson said the last time she can recall a homeowner being fined for an unauthorized alteration of a home was in 1998.

"Fortunately, it has been a very infrequent event," she said.

The city bases its fines in a "sum equal to the replacement value of the building in kind, or an amount set at the discretion of the court."

"The replacement value is based on a cost per square foot," Nelson said. "In this case, it

was \$150 per square foot."

City staff has recommended the fines be used for historic preservation activities, such as seminars and materials, Nelson said. But the funds could also go into the city's general fund.

In addition to fines, the city also placed severe restrictions on the size of any addition the homeowners could build on the property for the next five years. They can request that the floor area and density limits be removed; however, they must pay a \$630 fee and file their request no later than Friday, July 21.

Most homeowners in Pacific Grove abide by the city's rules, Nelson said. Still, the penalties send an important message.

"These [homes] are irreplaceable, so you want to make sure the community is compensated," Nelson said. "And it's also a matter of trying to ensure compliance with the city's ordinances and to let people know that adherence to plans and permits is required."

All that remains of this historic home on 13th Street is the foundation. The City of Pacific Grove ordered work be stopped on the home and slapped the owner with a \$90,000 fine for demolishing it.

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 06-06, passed and adopted on April 26, 2006, the District has initiated a proposal and application with the Monterey County Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCo"), pursuant to the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000, commencing with Section 56000 of the California Government Code and pertinent Sections 56653, 56700, and 56824.10, for a change of organization to allow the District to activate latent powers to provide law enforcement and security services within the District; and

WHEREAS, having made all required postings and notices, and having held all required hearings, on June 26, 2006, LAFCo approved without amendment, wholly and unconditionally, District's application to authorize implementation of those law enforcement and security services powers set out at Sections 61100(i) and 61100(j) of the California Government Code; and

WHEREAS, recognizing that the noted LAFCo authorization is plenary as to the powers authorized, District nonetheless desires at this time to implement those powers on a limited basis, as more particularly described below and as allowed by law, and to reserve District's right to implement on a broader basis should circumstances so dictate;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE PEBBLE BEACH COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The District hereby implements and activates those two powers, also known as functions or classes of services, approved by LAFCo as described hereinabove. **Provided, however,** that District's exercise of the two powers pursuant to this Ordinance shall be limited as follows:

To the extent reasonably practical, the new services shall be implemented on an incremental basis to augment services provided by existing law enforcement agencies sharing jurisdiction within the District.

The services shall be financed from District's available discretionary funds, and not from special assessments or taxes unless legally required approvals are obtained, including an election or elections where appropriate.

The services will be provided by contract, with traffic enforcement a priority, including use of radar and other technology. The contractor(s) will also provide general law enforcement and prevention of vandalism and crimes against property. Additional security services may be supplemented by use of a private security firm.

Section 2. As allowed by law, the District reserves the right at any time to implement and activate the two powers beyond the limited exercise set out in Section 1 hereof by modifying, deleting, or adding to that limited exercise. Such additional implementation and activation shall be taken only by ordinance following public notice and hearing, and subject to referendum.

Section 3. As provided in Section 61046(b) of the California Government Code, this ordinance is subject to referendum, as are all ordinances of the District dealing with legislative matters.

A crazy idea that has not gone away

TWO YEARS ago, a coastal commission bureaucrat was laughed out of Big Sur when he proposed that property owners be required to make new homes invisible when viewed from boats.

At a public meeting in April 2004, coastal planner Rick Hyman was greeted with catcalls when he tried to defend the idea to a roomful of Big Sur landowners, who already feel their community is being regulated out of existence by overzealous environmentalists.

So silly did the idea of protecting views from boats seem, Monterey County supervisor and coastal commissioner Dave Potter sided with the Big Sur residents, telling *The Pine Cone* the proposal to protect views from the ocean didn't pass the "laugh test," and that the commission had already decided that the ocean isn't a public viewing area, especially in a remote place such as Big Sur.

"We've said the view from the ocean isn't protected by the Coastal Act, but staff keeps bringing it up," Potter said in April 2004.

After all, if a person in a boat could somehow claim the right to look at private property along the coast without seeing any new development, why couldn't the far greater numbers of people flying over in airplanes claim the same right? Another question: If people in boats have a legal right not to see new development when they look at the coast, why don't people on the shore have a right to look at the sea without seeing boats?

For awhile, it seemed Hyman and his boss, coastal commission executive director Peter Douglas, had dropped the idea. Could it be that even they had the sense to give up on something that was truly preposterous? Alas, no.

It turns out they had already imposed a "views from boats" permit condition on a property owner in San Luis Obispo County. Dennis Schneider owns 40 acres north of Cayucos. His property gently rolls toward the sea from Highway 1. Fortunately for him, a terrace above the beach includes a lovely homesite which cannot be seen from the road but has a magnificent ocean view.

Unfortunately for him, any piece of land with an ocean view necessarily can also be seen from the sea. And when the coastal commission staff looked at Schneider's plans, they told him to move his house where it would not intrude on the "right" of people in kayaks, fishing boats and cruise ships to gaze at an untouched coast. Somehow, despite Potter's comments to the contrary, in April 2004 the commission itself concurred.

Schneider sued, claiming the coastal commission had exceeded its authority, and last week an appeals court agreed that the Coastal Act contains specific limits on what the commission can do.

"The Legislature has not empowered the commission to 'add' the factor of a boater's 'right to a view' of the coastline to deny or restrict development," a three-judge panel ruled in Schneider's favor.

This is a great victory for him and for the people of Big Sur. But it could be short-lived. According to newspaper reports, Douglas is planning an appeal to the California Supreme Court. And why shouldn't he? Private property owners can go broke (or crazy) fighting the coastal commission. But taxpayers always foot the bill for the other side.

Incorporation alternative

Dear Editor:

The July 7 item by Chris Counts concerning a land trust alternative to incorporation for Carmel Valley struck a responsive chord for me. For the past several years, we have been engaged in a bruising battle over the merits and demerits of incorporation as a method of controlling development in the valley. Until now, no other alternative has been given more than passing attention. I would like to suggest another alternative, the inspiration for which grows directly from our experience with the incorporation process to date.

The central argument for incorporation has been that the board of supervisors of Monterey County is the wrong body for making land use decisions in Carmel Valley.

The board is portrayed as beholden to developer interests, overwhelmed by demands for attention by constituents elsewhere in the county and generally indifferent to the values and interests of the people who live in the valley. These deficiencies can be overcome, the thinking goes, only by incorporating the valley as a self governing municipal entity.

Once initiated, the proposal to incorporate has been in the hands of the Local Agency Formation Commission of Monterey County. The process has been expensive and time consuming for all, with more yet to come before an estimated incorporation date of January 2008. One major achievement has been completion of a revenue neutrality agreement between the county and incorporation proponents. That agreement produced a result that reflects with some irony on the given reasons for incorporation.

It took 18 months to complete, but in the end the board of supervisors approved a plan of fiscal concessions that enabled the proposal to move forward toward a vote on incorporation by the people of the valley. The supervisors could have held out for more to cover county losses from incorporation but knew that doing so would have made the incorporation impossible on fiscal grounds. They said they wanted the decision to be made by the people of the valley — not by themselves — even if it proved to be at a disadvantage to the county. Both sides celebrated the outcome achieved.

Contained in this incident are the grounds for conceiving an alternative to incorpora-

tion that could have saved us a great deal of time and expense and may still have application should the incorporation fail at the ballot box. This is the power of negotiation over confrontation. Had our efforts been more devoted to seeking a resolution rather than a revolution, we might have had peace in the valley by this time. The board of supervisors is not a monster. The interests of the valley are not at odds with those of other groups in the county. We need to come together more than to divide. This is the lesson we have learned from all our travails and should seek to apply whether we incorporate or not.

Best seaside sanctuary

Dear Editor,

The latest AAA Via magazine features Pacific Grove, "Best Seaside Sanctuary." I have lived here since 1932 and, like many others, realize Pacific Grove's Marine Gardens Refuge is the city's most valuable asset. Quite fortuitously, the city gained inalienable rights to its waterfront by a deed from the state legislature in 1931.

In 1980, my husband, P.G. Mayor Florus Williams, worked closely with David Packard helping him achieve his aquarium. Mr. Packard called Florus almost daily for months for support as the aquarium leased land from P.G. The Via author writes, "one third of the aquarium resides in Pacific Grove."

For fifteen years the aquarium and Hopkins Marine Station collected marine life from P.G.'s tidepools without cost, except the fish and game permit fee. This abusive harvesting stopped after citizens protested. A successful city-wide initiative in 2000 prohibited this "free for all" taking of our marine resources.

Currently fish and game is again implementing the Marine Life Protection Act. Its latest proposal seeks to acquire one third of Pacific Grove's refuge from Hopkins Marine Station to Lover's Point as Hopkins State Marine Reserve.

How ironic Packard Foundation funded \$2.8 million or one third of the \$7.5 million dollars needed to jumpstart fish and game.

It's true, you can get what you pay for!

Walkers beware. Our kitchen window faces a very busy

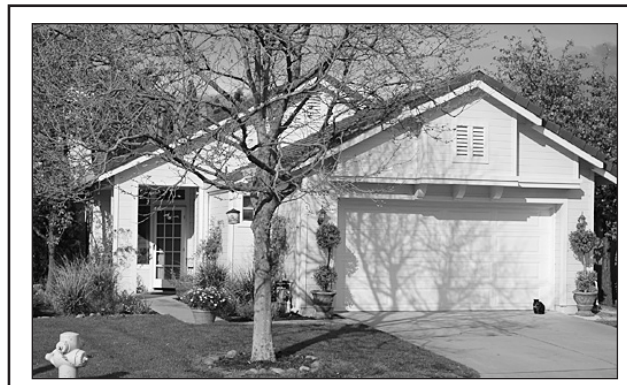
intersection in Carmel. I have never seen so many rolling stops, no stops, people on cell phones, etc.

W.A. Mozart joins J.S. Bach at center of 2006 fest

FOR ITS 69th season, and its fourth at the new Sunset Center, the Carmel Bach Festival has chosen to add plenty of Mozart to its programs. This is hardly surprising, because Jan. 27 was Mozart's 250th birthday, and this concert season has seen orgies of Mozart performances all over Europe and the rest of the classical music world.

This summer's Salzburg Festival, for instance, is featuring fully staged shows of *all* of his operas. Most people who make a living in the classical music racket, including this writer, find this unnecessary and even annoying because Mozart, of all people, doesn't *need* a year. It strikes me that the world's bakers might as well declare one year to be the year of bread: it brings up the question of what to bake all those other years. Mozart is that central to orchestras and opera houses that one can claim, without exaggeration, that every year is a Mozart year.

Exploring Bach's influence

It wasn't always thus; until the Nazis drove Fritz Busch out of Germany and he started the Glyndebourne Festival in the 1930s, Mozart's operas were much less well represented than now.

However, a Bach festival like Carmel's always needs to emphasize a second composer and use the pairing to explore either his influence on Bach, or vice versa. That being the case, in 2006, Mozart is the logical choice. As we shall see, Bach's influence on Mozart was intense and sudden. Sometime in the early 1780s, a friend and fellow freemason, the Swedish diplomat Baron Gottfried van Swieten, gave Mozart some scores by Bach, and he understood immediately, as only a genius could, that counterpoint was still emotionally potent, that the art of fugue was not dead, but only dormant, and waiting for *him* to take it to the next level. And the next level of counterpoint and fugue after Bach, not to mince words, is the last movement of the Jupiter Symphony, which will be played this year on Tuesday nights.

Those of you lucky enough to be there should close your eyes and let this simple fact sink in: the Jupiter

Finale is the next step in the evolution of the art of the fugue, after "The Art of the Fugue." It just needed forty years — and the input of a genius — to get there.

Also on Tuesdays, several bits of Mozart operas will be given, in Italian and German. Some of these, like "Non piu andrai" from *The Marriage of Figaro* show no real influence of Bach even though written well after Mozart

caught the fugue bug from reading Bach's scores; they are just great music and worth playing.

Like the Jupiter Symphony, the sextet from *Figaro* would not, I believe, have turned out the same without van Swieten and his gift. This sextet, which legend says was Mozart's personal favorite of his own pieces, is a remarkable reconciliation in music, where former enemies become friends (through the admittedly corny device of finding out they are long-unknown mother and son, but if the pretense of the reconciliation is stogy and corny, the emotions put into music are very real). Marcellina's first line, which takes *Figaro* musically into her embrace, is simple to understand, even if the Italian words are not; the emotion, "let's kiss and make up," of her melody jumps out at you.

Later on, at a point where a lesser composer would repeat the same line to embrace, in her turn, Susanna, Mozart gives the line to the winds and writes a counterpoint to it for the singer, a counterpoint which Bach would never have written, but towards which Bach pointed the way.

Further in the sextet, the two "bad guys" — who don't get reconciled, but remain angry and destructive to the end — fit their angular music into the sweet music of the

four "good guys" so cleverly that one could forget the very different emotional temperatures coexisting.

This counterpoint of contrasting emotions we take for granted in the opera house today, for it was used extensively by Verdi, Puccini, Massenet, and others. But there was a time when it was brand new, and its inventor was most definitely Mozart, encouraged by his contact with the music of Bach.

The Magic Flute

Also represented is Mozart's Masonic music, on Saturdays during the Bach Fest, with the Magic Flute overture and the two Masonic Cantatas. The case has been amply made that the Magic Flute is a Masonic opera; the Masons favorite number, three, runs all through it, and the Egyptian setting and rites of passage towards wisdom all have a strong Masonic feeling to them. This is particularly appropriate because van Swieten, who was responsible for Mozart's coming into contact with the works of Bach, was a fellow member of the Crowned Hope Lodge in Vienna. Perhaps it is worth pointing out that if van Swieten had not given some Bach manuscripts to Mozart, it is entirely

conceivable that no one else would have done so and that the younger master would have died in ignorance of the music of the older.

This year's program also features works by the other two masters born in Bach's birth year, 1685 — Vivaldi and Handel.

Both composers will be represented on the two "concerto" evenings, Monday and Thursday, which are bound to be a lot of fun. Friday nights include "Israel in Egypt," Handel's dramatic oratorio, which is a fabulous piece! (Handel's operas and oratorios are really underrepresented in the worlds opera houses; he still awaits his Fritz Busch to make them as central as they deserve to be.)

A sure high point, but a very familiar one, will be the Saint John Passion, to be heard on Sunday afternoons. Much less familiar but equally tempting will be the Mission Concert program on Wednesdays, billed as a "Mexican Baroque Christmas." It is a fascinating pairing of sacred music by 18th century Mexican composer Ignacio de Jerusalem with popular Mexican songs, still on a Christmas theme.

In addition to all that, the usual recitals, master classes and lectures will mean more good music than anyone could possibly take in, but it should be fun trying!

In June 2002, Sunset Center was just a shell as it underwent a \$21.4-million renovation. The massive community undertaking transformed a former grammar school auditorium into the Monterey Peninsula's premiere concert hall.



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With so much to choose, picking the best is a critic's pleasure

MUCH LIKE an enormous, gilt-edged menu, the program for the 69th season of the Carmel Bach Festival includes an almost overwhelming embarrassment of riches.

How do you choose and what are your limits when you factor in your taste, your time, your money and ultimately your physical and aural endurance?

It was a remarkable indulgence for me to be asked to make my own personal "Best of the Fest" choices and to dream about the high points and more enjoyable events I would recommend to Pine Cone readers, drawing on my experience of many past festivals.

I would begin with the opening Saturday night concert because it has a very special and unusual program to start the week's musical festivities.

Maestro Bruno Weil has chosen two of the most beloved and familiar Bach cantatas to begin and end the concert. They are the resplendent "Lobe den Herren" and the celebratory "Wachet auf ruft uns die Stimme." Also included are two of Mozart's rarely performed "Masonic Cantatas," K471 and K623. The latter was his last completed work.

Weil customarily includes a modern work in the festival. This year's piece — Frank Martin's enjoyable "Pasacaille" for strings — adds to an unusual and stimulating mixture of musical styles on the Saturday night program.

St. John Passion

Sunday afternoons customarily rotate the Bach major choral works and this year it is the turn of the intense and dramatic "St. John Passion" — a treasured event for festival audiences. The performance utilizes the full vocal

and orchestral forces of the Carmel Bach Festival and Weil has always created a riveting atmosphere. I look forward to it being created again.

Not the usual

The Tuesday evening program sounds like it'll be a fun change of pace. It is billed as "Encountering Mozart: The Aha! Concert," with Weil and Bach Festival education director David Gordon. There will certainly be witty words to go with selections from favorite symphonies and operatic arias. I would take a chance on this one.

Always a hit

Of course, the Mission concert on Wednesday night is always a winner and one of the most popular evenings of

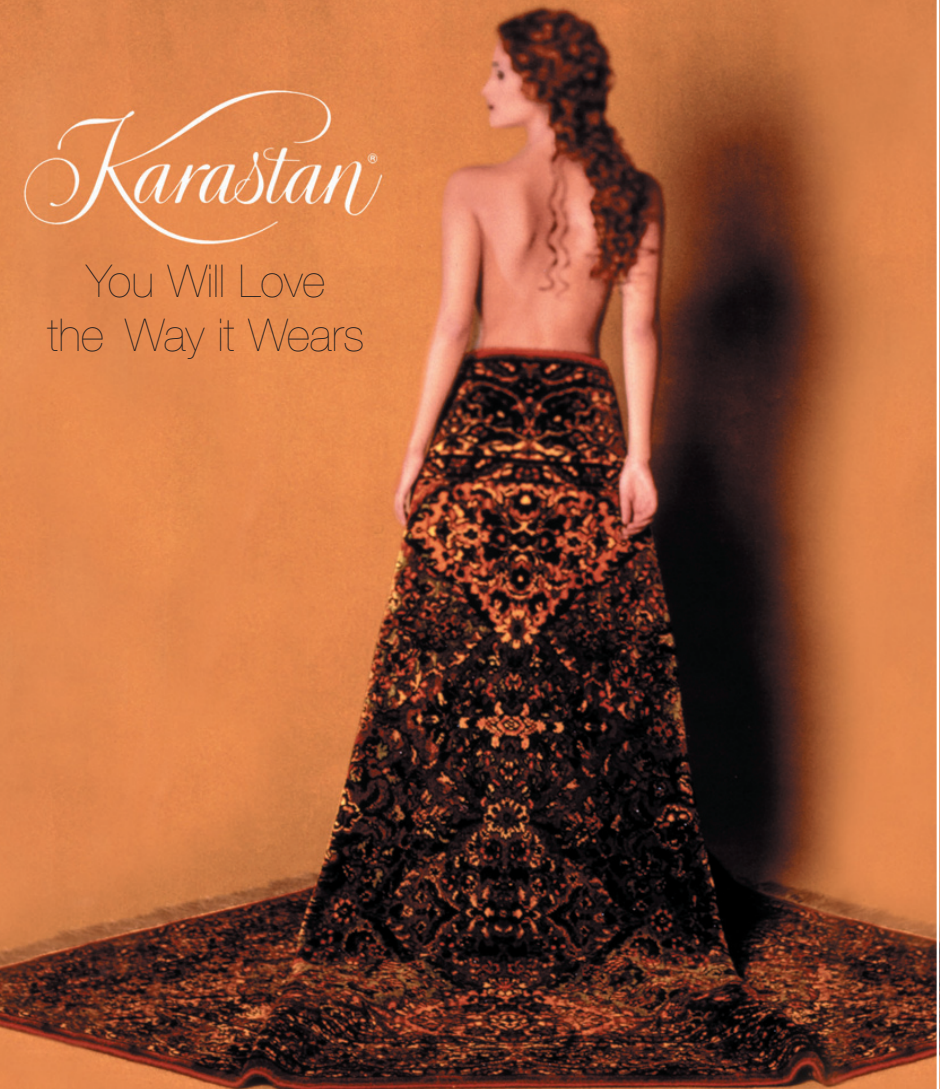

the festival. Under the direction of William Jon Gray, the program is gemlike and off the beaten musical path. The excellent Festival Chorale will be heard in Italian-born Mexican Baroque composer Isaac Jerusalem's "Polychoral Mass in D Major," written for the Mexican Church, and also other selections to make up a "Mexican Baroque Christmas." This is lovely music and surprisingly appealing.

Handel masterpiece

The Friday night program will bring each week's evening concerts to a monumental conclusion. Under the baton of Gray, the fest's full forces will perform Georg Friedrich Handel's magnificent oratorio, "Israel in Egypt." Here is another

example of the beauty of a festival situation because the resources necessary to do justice to this enormous and exciting choral masterpiece are rarely available except in such a setting. I happily anticipate this concert.

Not to be overlooked

Now we go from the magnum to the miniature because there will be so many expert and highly experienced instrumentalists and vocalists present. They have, in the past, appeared to enjoy performing as soloists or in small ensembles and, therefore, the afternoon "Intermezzo" recitals at 2:30 p.m. have become a special source of musical pleasure for festival attendees. Lasting about an hour or so, they take place at All Saints Church — one of the most acoustically satisfying venues in the area.

Actually, these recitals offer a remarkable variety of music and it would be diffi-

cult to pick and choose among them so I go to as many as I can. Mondays feature harpsichordist Yuko Tanaka plus a string quartet playing a variety of keyboard concertos by J.S. Bach, C.P.E. Bach and Mozart — all delightful music that offers a great way to start the week.

Tuesdays' "Classic Strings" features Mozart, von Dittersdorf and Boccherini string works. These are melodious, pleasing pieces. Wednesdays bring baritone Sanford Sylvan and bass Michael Dean singing two treasurable Bach solo cantatas, accompanied by a string group. I surely wouldn't miss either one.

English stage music is on board for Thursday. Selections by Matthew Locke and Henry Purcell will be sung by Angelique Zuluaga and Sally Anne Russell with string accompaniment.

Friday is Handel day with the recital featuring Kendra Colton in soprano arias and also some instrumental works. There is a distinguished accompanying group.

Saturday is the culmination of the recital series. It is a major effort and a charmer with its "Salzburg Serenades." Elizabeth Wallfisch will lead a chamber orchestra in Leopold Mozart's "Toy Symphony," his Trumpet Concerto and his son's "Serenata Notturna" K 239 and the "Wind Serenade" K 375.

Ready for more?

At this point, one's endurance starts to

come into play, because there are many other enjoyable musical outings possible in other venues. The Wednesday late afternoon concerts at 5:30 p.m. in the Church in the Forest in Pebble Beach offer complimentary wine and cheese but, more importantly, on July 19 the Mozart Flute Quartet in D and the Viola Quintet in G Minor make up a very special program of beloved music in a lovely setting.

The candlelight concerts at 9 p.m. Thursdays at All Saints Church feature solo string works by J.S. Bach and should be relaxed yet virtuosic outings by distinguished members of the orchestra.

Elizabeth Wallfisch can be heard Sunday evenings at Monterey's La Mirada museum (a new and charmingly atmospheric venue) playing the "Mystery Sonatas" by Heinrich Biber. These are intriguing works which are rarely encountered on concert programs elsewhere.

Of course, if you are interested in the intricacies of how a vocalist becomes an expert in Baroque style, every Monday and Thursday at noon at Carmel Presbyterian Church, David Gordon and festival vocal soloists help train four young professional singers in this art. I have usually found these free sessions and their final concert enjoyable and enlightening.

Be you a musical gourmet or a musical gourmand, choose carefully, don't overdose, and have a wonderful time.

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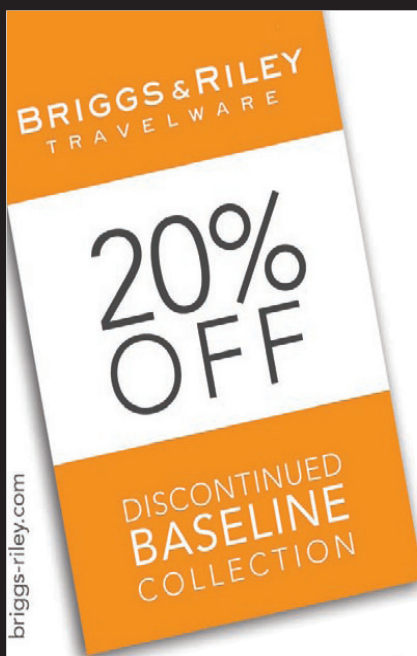
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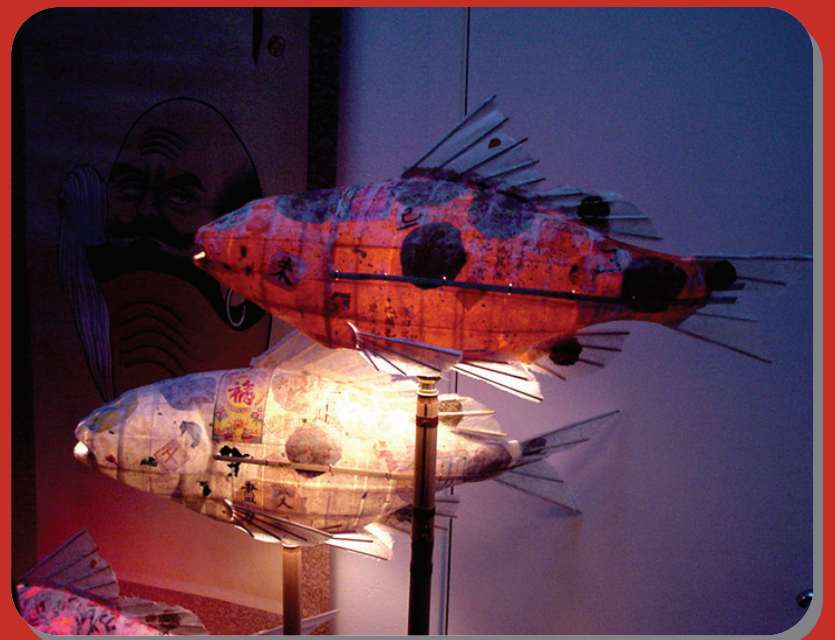
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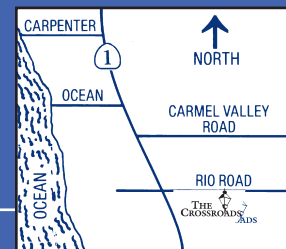

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Between concerts: Having lunch in Carmel-by-the-Sea

EVEN ON a foggy day, lunching out in Carmel-by-the-Sea can be an exhilarating experience. But choosing from the 45-some restaurants open for lunch within this one-square-mile village can be daunting.

To help Bach Festival aficionados sustain themselves with food between, say, a 10:30 a.m. lecture in Carpenter Hall and a 2:30 p.m. recital at All Saints Church, we've selected a half-dozen excellent luncheon spots — all easily accessible by walking in the downtown section of the village. A listing is appended of 40 other restaurants open for lunch and awaiting your patronage.



Entering **Patisserie Boissiere Restaurant and Bakery**, on Mission between Ocean and Seventh, is like walking into an elegant European coffee house. It's rather like a mini Kranzler Cafe on the Hauptwache in Frankfurt-am-Main, only without the string quartet.

Patrons enter directly into the bakery display area where they must wait to be seated at a table. Eyeing all those splendid freshly made pies, cakes and cookies will surely melt any resolve against calories and carbs, but it presents an opportunity to request a dessert selection be set aside until after lunch and before anyone else can put dibs on it.

The Patisserie offers a luncheon special daily, which is shown on a chalkboard at the entrance, and the menu offers a fine selection of salads, croissant sandwiches, quiche, and seafood and meat entrees. A few excellent wines are offered by the glass.

A hands-down favorite luncheon here is the crab salad composed of large chunks of crab, avocado, tomato, cucumber and lettuce with an excellent dressing served in a covered sauce pot with a spout that really pours.

A fireplace in the dining room is always lighted on foggy or overcast days.



Little Napoli, on Dolores between Seventh and Ocean, is another restaurant with Old World charm. Even before entering, visitors know it's going to be enchanting by the gaily striped awnings over the front windows and Italian flags snapping smartly in the breeze above the entrance. Comfortable sidewalk benches and planted flower boxes are inviting.

The high-beamed ceilings, working fireplace, Italian background music and kitchen fragrances welcome patrons inside.

House specialties include baked cannelloni, lamb shank, wild petrale sole, spaghetti and clams and seafood/shellfish entrees. Little Napoli's garlic bread is made with the family's 100-year-old recipe. The restaurant's one-plate lunch special offers a choice of any half pizza served with a small green salad and soup, or a choice of any half pasta served with a

small green salad or small Caesar salad.
Excellent wine list.



Sushi Heaven Japanese restaurant, Dolores between Seventh and Eighth, is a joy to the eye as well as the palate with its wasabi green and ginger flower orange decor and its fresh sashimi, sushi, nigiri and makimono rolls. Udon noodles with fish, chicken, shell fish or vegetables, and donburi dishes of rice topped with meat, fish, eggs or vegetables are offered. Bento boxes are a favorite with the luncheon crowd and are a good value with a bowl of miso soup and a generous sampling of salad, tempura, teriyaki, sushi and steamed rice.

Reserve room for a spectacular dessert of tempu-

ra ice cream encased in light pastry, then deep fried.
Beer, wine and sake are offered.



PortaBella, Ocean between Lincoln and Monte Verde, known for its Mediterranean and French country cooking, serves soups, salads, sandwiches and main plates for lunch in the flower-filled patio that entices locals and visitors and their dogs on sunny days. On cooler days, the fireplace inside makes patrons feel right at home.

Roasted corn and crab bisque is one of Porta Bella's well liked soups, while a salad of seared scallops, prawns and citrus is one of six salads made

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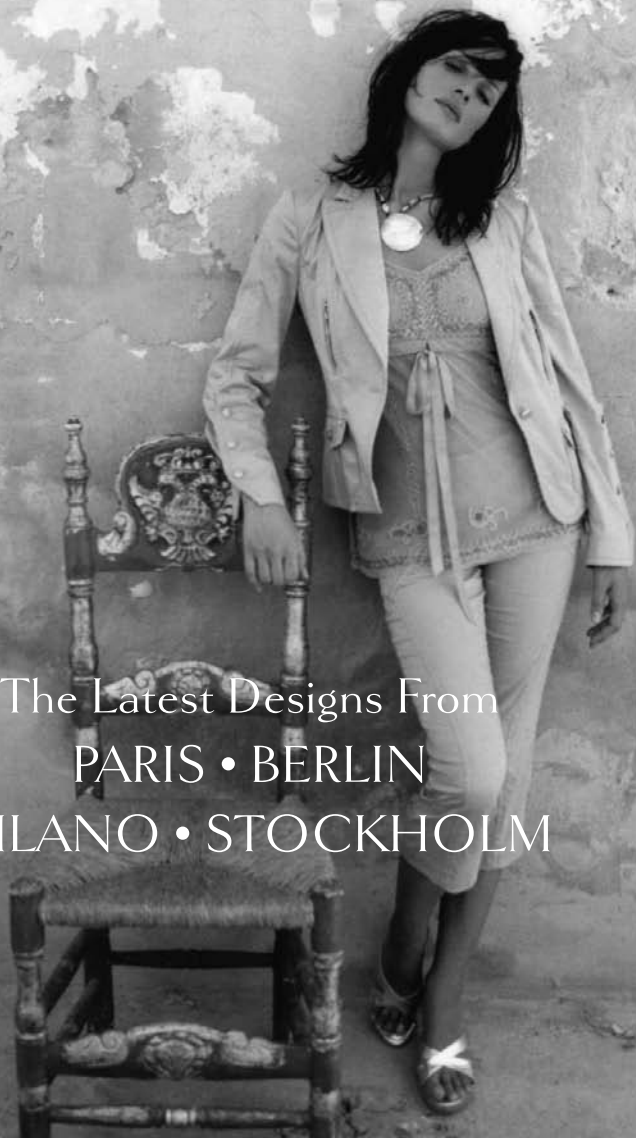

with local produce.

Main plates include fresh grilled salmon, grilled scampi Provençal, duck and feta ravioli and angel hair pasta with mussels and rock shrimp.

Sandwiches include a focaccia steak — top sirloin, Tuscan spices, grilled shallots on focaccia bread, and country fries; grilled chicken pita; tartina alla PortaBella and a provolone burger.

Excellent wine list and full bar.

Buon Giorno Bakery and Cafe is one of those happy finds visitors stumble on. Recessed in a little court on Junipero just north of Sixth, it has flower-filled gardens in both the front and back small patios, while inside yellow slurried floors, black-and-white-framed photographs of coffee cups adorn the walls, big jars of dog treats for both small and big dogs are there for the taking. A stuffed faux zebra dressed in a tux and wearing roller skates serves as greeter.

All manner of espresso coffee drinks are offered and fresh baked goods are temptingly displayed. But if you come for lunch you can indulge in an Italian panino (try the ham and cheese)—toasted on an authentic Italian panini press and served with a small salad with a balsamic dressing, and French fries done the French way — twice fried. Here a simple sandwich, salad and fries can be a sumptuous luncheon because each of these components is made with great care, the freshest produce and quality cheese and ham.

Small but excellent wine list.

You can bring the family pooch, too.

Il Fornaio at the Pine Inn, Ocean and Monte Verde, has two options for lunch: Really casual coffee house fare, including pizza by the slice in the atrium, or more upscale options at the ristorante, contiguous with the cafe.

Salads, such as the spinach, bacon, aged ricotta, red onions, mushrooms and walnut salad, or insalata caprese are two good choices.

Pizza al forno and nine pastas are so good it's difficult to choose just one.

Salmon, chicken and veal dishes round out the luncheon fare, but vegetarians are not forgotten: A melange of grilled seasonal vegetables drizzled with extra virgin olive oil, appears on the menu. Full bar.

Fifth; **The Cottage Restaurant**, Lincoln and Seventh; **Anton and Michel**, in Court of the Fountains, Mission between Ocean and Seventh; **Katy's Place**, Mission between Fifth and Sixth, and **Piatti Ristorante**, Sixth at Junipero.

Also, **Flaherty's Oyster Bar and Seafood Grill**, Sixth between Dolores and San Carlos; **Tita's Cafe**, San Carlos between Ocean and Seventh; **Arawan Thai Cafe**, Golden Bough Courtyard, Ocean between Monte Verde and Lincoln and **Tommy's Wok**, Mission between Ocean and Seventh.

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J.S. Bach — inspiration for generations of composers

THE MAN whose musical genius is celebrated at the Carmel Bach Festival, and who inspired generations of other great composers, has a reputation for having been a dour, serious person who worked hard all the time and didn't laugh much.

While we will never know how much laughter there was in the Bach household for the simple reason that laughter leaves no record of itself, we do know that certain well documented events of his childhood would have made any one of us into a humorless person, if not outright depressed.

Think of it: In 1695, young Johann Sebastian lost his mother, then his father remarried within a few months, only to die soon after. Bach was, at the age of 10, left in the care of a stepmother whom he had only just met.

Even for the 17th century — when serious illness routinely carried people off while their families watched helplessly, waiting for antibiotics to be invented and invoking the Will of God — this was serious stuff.

Perhaps inevitably, the situation with the stepmother didn't work out and the 10-year-old was soon bundled off to live

with his brother, Johann Christoph, then 24 and just married.

Johann Christoph, like virtually the whole family, was in the music business, making a living playing, singing and composing in the service of a church, duke, or town.

This big brother became Bach's harpsichord and composition teacher and, surely in an effort to keep his pupil from outgrowing his instruction too quickly, did

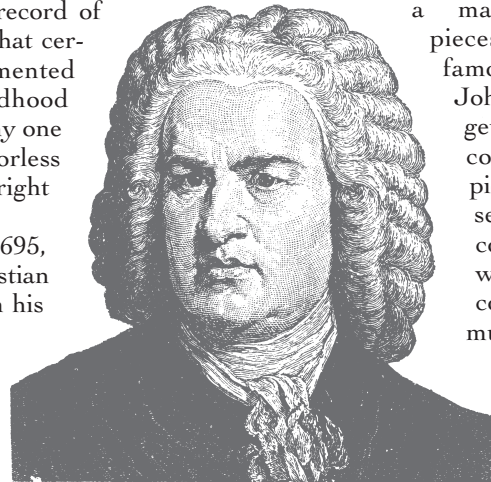
not allow the youngster to study a manuscript containing pieces by several then-famous composers.

Johann Sebastian tried to get around this rule by copying the forbidden pieces by moonlight over several months. Of course his disobedience was punished and the copy destroyed, which must have been heart-breaking, yet another assault on a normal childhood.

Childhood ended

By the time J. S. Bach was 15, whatever childhood he had was over. He moved to Lüneburg in the north of Germany to sing in the Matins Choir, first as a boy soprano, then as a tenor. It must have been clear to him even then that his whole life would be music, whatever form it might take: singing, fiddling, playing keyboards,

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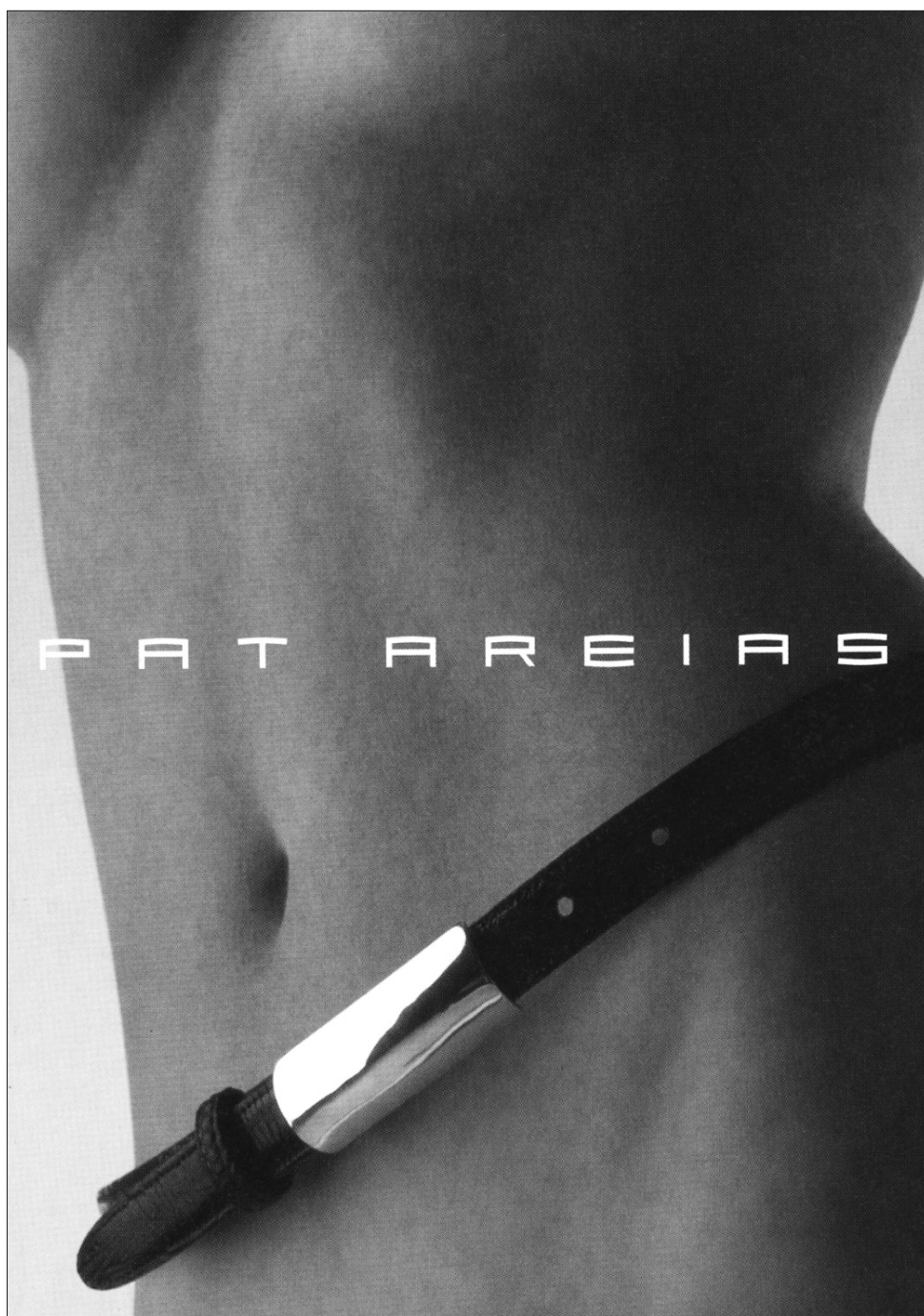

teaching, arranging and composing.

He was, at 15, a hardworking, professional, underpaid musician, and would remain so for the rest of his life, moving from one North German town to another, following the work.

Bach made his music in the service of orthodox Lutheranism, which was rather high-church with elaborate music, as opposed to the then-fashionable Pietism, in which music played a much smaller role.

Pietism, a bit like present-day Charismatic Christianity, with its emphasis on a personal relationship to God, may not have gone as far as altar calls and speaking in tongues, but it was of that general tendency.

Lutheran Orthodoxy — a direct descendant of Martin Luther's break with the Catholic Church in 1521 — was Bach's faith, and it went for solemnity and glory in the service of God, and, above all, more music. Did he adhere to the faith because that's where the work was?

On the contrary, Bach evidently was completely sincere, and, lucky man, never seems to have had doubts.

It is well documented that Bach didn't suffer fools gladly. He hated having to teach Latin and music to unruly teenagers, and he regularly refused to do so, to the repeated distress of his employers. He also couldn't bear inferior musicians, and in a story on which all biographers agree, once took off his wig and threw it at an incompetent harpsichordist!

He sometimes showed an indifference to the rules, as when he asked for, and got, a month off from Arnstadt to go to Lübeck and hear the Danish composer and organist Buxtehude, and showed up back at work four months later, not even having written to let his boss know.

We know how important Bach's music is, but in his day, he was unfavorably compared to Telemann and Kuhnau, and many others who are now completely forgotten.

Despite all of this, Bach was not a revolutionary. He accepted his calling and his station. He set himself the task of making his faith audible, and succeeded to an extent that is still not completely known.

His music speaks strongly to our secular age, meaning even more than it meant to the devout Lutherans of 1750 Leipzig. Who knows what comfort and inspiration people will draw from him in the future. •

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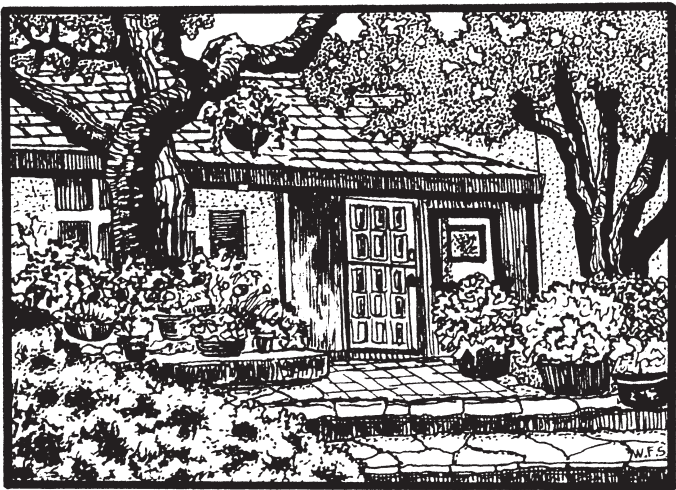
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
