## Carmelites Turn Out More Regular School For Irish Night Attendance Urged

Were the patron saint of the people and the land of the shamrock and the harp alive today he surely would pause long enough in his task of chasing reptiles to pronounce a blessing on Mother Carrington.
She remembered that "somewhere in France" the sons of Ireland were fighting for their country and their King.
During the rendition of the familiar Irish songs, there was not one in the audience but who would have voted "Home rule for Ireland" at once.
The stage production and musical given at the Manzanita Theatre Friday night, entitled "The Blind Musician and a Merry Company," was a decided success in every respect.
In a large measure, the artistic success of the affair may be attributed to the surprises and novel ideas the producer was : ble to introduce.

Who, save Mrs. Carrington, would have had the patience to rehearse a drill corps of mere babies? - "My babies," as she affectionately terms them. And who could make of tin pans, in the hands of children, a genuine musical novelty?

And the costumes, from the Potato to the shapely Cadets, were appropriate and pretty.
During the evening the splendid ability of Mrs. Carrington as a piano instructor was demonstrated by the artistic rendition of a number of difficult compositions by the pupils.
Begorra, it was a fine show, and there was a large attendance.

As the Captain of the Cadets remarked toward the close of the entertainmen: "This will be a red-letter day in the history of the town."

The apportionment of funds for the maintenance of primary and grammar schools in California is based upon attendance.
At a recent meeting of the Carmel school board, while the matter of finances was under discussion, the question of the need of better attendance was referred to.
At county headquarters attendance records are computed very closely. Suppose, for instance, a pupil is tardy five minutes on six occasions during the term-that makes half an hour. If ten children are similarly late-and this does occur-that is nearly a school day lost.
This school day, together with other absences, excuses for early dismissal for one thing or another, holidays and special occasions, is deducted from the attendance recordsand cannot be made up.

Thus, because of the decreased attendance, the money allowed for maintenance is cut down.

Parents are urged to see that children attending the local school be as regular and prompt as possible.

Monterey to Fiesno Direct
Through the efforts of the Monterey and the Fresno Chambers of Commerce a passenger coach will be attached to train No. 27, leaving Monterey at 8:20 a.m., straight to Fresno. At Fresno, Train No. 83 will have a coach direct to Monterey. When it gets too hot in Fresno, relief is assured by a visit to Carmel-by-the-Sea.

## School Trustees to Meet

There will be a School Trustees' institute held at Salinas next Saturday. It is expected that every sehool district in Monterey county will be represented. At the meeting of the Sunset School trustees last Thursday, W. L. Overstreet was chosen to represent Carmel. Miss A. C. Edmonds is alternate.

## "An Evening With Shakespeare"

On or about April 28, there is to be presented, under the auspices of the Arts and Crafts Club, an affair which may be termed "An Evening With Shakespeare."

The program will be made up of a series of songs, dances, readings and tableaux. Most of the action is based upon adaptations from "Twelfth Night." Much of the music is that in vogue during the life of Shakespeare, and will make a decided hit.
So far as possible this will be a performance in which children will take the main parts, and dressed in the costumes of the period, should be most picturesque.

## Mother of Local Resident Passes Away

On March 9th last there died at San Juan, in San Benito county, within a few hours of each other, Frances Arcello and the venerable Father Closa.
Mrs. Arcello was the grandmother of Mrs. H. M. Clevenger, a resident of Carmel, and is survived also by two child-ren-Mrs. Elizabeth Twitchell mother of Mrs. Clevenger, and John Estrade; a brother, several grandehildren and great grandchildren are also left to mourn her loss.
Mrs. Arcello was born about 1830 near Laurellas, some sixteen miles from Carmel, at which place her father farmed one hundred acres of land acquired by means of a Spanish grant in recognition of military service.
It is interesting to relate the fact that Mrs. Arcello was baptised at Carmel Mission by Rev. Father Ramon Abella, during the presidency of Jose Bernardo Sanchez.
For many years the deceased was an intimate friend of Father Closa, and frequently in late years they would speculate as to which would survive the other. The former died at $4: 30$ in the morning and the latter at 2 in the after noon of the same day.

Migratory Bird Law
A misleading statement has recently become current to the effect that the federal Department of Agriculture had suspended the enforcement of the regulations under the migratory bird law, and thereby has enabled sportsmen, under the state laws, to shoot wild fowl.
The facts are that under the federal regulations, now in force, the season on all migratory wild fowl is closed until next fall throughout the United States. Inspectors and waidens are required, and others interested in the protection of wild fowl requested, to report to the Department of Agriculture all cases of violations of the regulations.

## Protecting the Buyer

For the first time, this year growers of berries will be obliged to standardize their boxes and baskets. The state sealer of weights and measures has instructed county sealers of weights to demand a standard weight of berries when offered for sale in containers.
According to a law recently enacted berries must be packed in the various containers which shall hold berries in the following amounts: Eight and twelve ounces, one and two pounds. The minimum contents mus a approximate the true net weight.

## Notice to <br> TAXPAYERS

All taxpayers are required by the constitution to annually make and deliver to the Assessor a statement, under oath, setting forth specifically ALL the real, personal, or other class of property, owned by such persons, or in their possession, or under their control, as the same stands of record at $120^{\circ}$ clock Meridian on the first Monday of March.

The Political Code provides, that all property must be assessed at its "full cash value," and defines "full cash value" as being "the amount at which the property would be taken in payment of a just debt from a solvent debtor."
Unsecured Personal Property
The taxes on all unsecured personal property are due and payable and must be paid at the time the assessment is made.

## Exemptions

Any person or association, claiming any property to be exempt from taxation, MUST make the claim and affidavit, for such exemption, every year, in the manner provided by law. This applies to the $\$ 100$ allowed on personal property of householders; the $\$ 1000$ allowed soldiers, sailors, marines, etc., and property used solely and exclusively for religious worship.

## Assessments

Any information desired relating to assessments will be gladly furnished on application, and all objections should be made before the Board of Equalization adjourns, instead of waitIng until it is time to pay taxes.
Remember, that if you fail to make a statement you fail to comply with the law and you lay yourself liable to arbitrary assessment, which is expensive to yourself and causes much trouble to others.

In reply to a published statement to the effect that the fish and game law relative to gathering of abaiones is being violated by catching them with diving apparatus near Pebble Beach, Phil H. Oyer, Deputy Fish and Game Commissioner, writes as follows:

There is no law protibiting the catching of abalones at that point with diving apparatus.

## The only law existan on

 abalones in Districts 17 and 18, which constitutes the coast from Santa Cruz to the southerly line of San Juis Obispo county, prohibits the use of a spear in catching nbulones and makes no mention of diving apparatus.Fishermen are not allowed to gather abalomes for commercial purposes in District 10, which comprises vaters and tide lands to high water mark of that portion of Mou terey bay lying to the south of a line drawn from tho extreme northerly point of Point Pinos in a straight line East erly to the eastern shore of Monterey Bay to a point morth of Seaside, said puint being marked by a permauent monument placed by the United States government surveyors and designated as "Monterey N.O.T.C. and G. S. Station.
