Every male persou in the United States who has attained his twenty. first birthday and has not attnined his thirty-first birthday, regardless of his citizenship, must register in bis nome precinct.

A severe penalty awaits those who do not register. After the day of registratiou any onm may be called upou by a peace officer to show his registration certificate, akeu pon falure to do so, may be akea into custody without war required to seek ont or request those liable to conform with the law.
Those who will be absent from their home precincts on June 5 shonld register pt the office of the County (Merk. Those who through physical disability, absence, or illness, will be unable to present themselves at their registration place ou the day designated, must secure registration cards and have them in the hatids of their precinct offlcials on June 5 .

## A Remarkable Tree

Not far from Carmel-by-the Sea, in the Monterey National Forest, there grows the Bristlecone or Santa Lucia Fir. This tree is found nowhere in the world but in the Santa Lucia Mountains. Its dense crown, shaped like an Indian-club, and often ending in a point or spire, its deep, lustrous, green foliage and its drooping tast seled branches are so distinctive that the tree can be recognized at a long distance. It is the only true fir in this region, although white fir is found both to the north and the south. It has been planted as an ornamental tree in Europe and in this country, but owing to the low germinating power and transient vitality of the seed, propagation is difficult. The number of trees in existence is about 3000 .

## Fair and Square

Under the new military conscridtion law, a drafted man may not purchase exemption. Thus the disgraceful Civil War poster, "Substitute Wanted!" will not offend the very name of democracy in the present war. Furthermore, there are to be no bounties, no can any man buy himself out of the sérvice. For these and many other reasons, the new army bill is a fair and square law.
J. Ogden Armour of the Illinois State Council of Defense, which is calling upon Congress to pass legislation placing the control of food products in the hands of Federal officials, is chief owner of one of the largest industries in this country to be affected by any such radical step.

## Prune and Nut Salad

Select the best prumes for this purpose. Cook in the ustual way, letting the liquor evaporate during the end of the cooking. Dran and hill prunes. Remove pits. Cut prumes in five pieces. Mix prunes and nut meats, and spriukle with salt and paprika. For balf pouud prumes and quarter pound shelled unt meats use one cup whipping cream. Whip cream until solid, season with half teaspann each salt and paprika, add three tablespoons lemon juice slowly while beating. Mix two-thirds of the cream with the prunes and nuts. Arrange the heart leaves of lettuce on individual plates, pile scime of the mix-
ture in each and cover with re ture in each and cover with remaining whipped cream. Lay a few pieces of prnue on tod of each portion.

## Notice to <br> TAXPAYERS

All taxpayers are required by the constitution to annually make and deliver to the Assessor a statement, under oath, setting forth specifically A L L the real, personal, or other class of property, owned by such persons, or in their possession, or under their control, as the same stands of record at 12 o'clock Meridian on the first Monday of March.

The Political Code provides, that all property must be assessed at its "full cash value," and defines "full cash value" as being "the amount at which the property would be taken in payment of a just debt from a solvent debtor.'

Unsecured Personal Property
The taxes on all unsecured personal property are due and payable and must be paid at the time the assessment is made.

## Exemptions

Any person or association, claiming any property to be exempt from taxation, MUST make the claim and affidavit, for such exemption, every year, in the manner provided by law. This applies to the $\$ 100$ allowed on personal property of householders; the $\$ 1000$ allowed soldiers, sailors, marines, etc., and property used solely and exclusively for religions worship.

## Assessments

Any information desired relating to assessments will be gladly furnished on application, and all objections should be made before the Board of Equalization adjourns, instead of waiting until it is time to pay taxes.
Remember, that if you fail to make a statement you fail to comply with the law and you law yourself liable to arbitrary assessment, which is expensive to yourself and causes much trouble to others.
