## War Stamps on Sale at Local Postoffice

## What's the Matter With Carmel?

So far, ouly a very few of the stamps have been sold in Carmel Dorit let us lag behind other communities, where heavy sales are reported.

The war serviugs certilicate campaign was insugurated throughout the conntry Moulay morning. It is one of the most vital undertakiugs of the government sinct the wat began.
In its broadest aspects it contemplates that a hundred miilion persons shall invest $\$ 20$ each dur ing the coming twelve months save it and loan it to the govern ment at interest.
The plan is very simple. Be ginuing next Monday there will be placed on sale at postoffices aud other public places two varieties of stamps-War Saviugs stamps of the denomination of $\$ 5$, selling for $\$ 4.12$, and Thrift stamps, selling at 25 ceuts.

The purchaser of a War Savings stamp obtains the promise of the government to pay $\$ 5$ at the end of live years, or on January 1, 1923
A Thrift stamp purchaser waits until he has acqured sixteen 25 cent stamps, amounting to $\$ 4$, whereupon he exchanges the cant upon which they are pasted at any of the places where the stamps are on sale and receive oue of the. War Saving stamps upon payment of 12 cents
The purchaser of a Wiar Saviugs stamp at $\$ 4.12$ is given a war-savings certificate, to which may be affixed tweuty of the same stamps. This certficate will bear his name and address.

The plan provides that no one may buv more than $\$ 100$ worth of the War Saving Stamps at oue time, and no one is allowed to own over $\$ 1000$ worth in all.

Those of small or moderate means should embrace this oppor tunity to assist the goverument Even children may purchase the 25 cent stamps.

By order of the postmaster general, letters, postcards and printed matter mailed in the United States for transmission to the United States expeditionary forees in Europe will be accepted at ordinary domestic postage rates.

Bret Harte's Visit to Anthony Froude

Having put the affairs of the Consular office [at Crefield, Prussia] upou a proper footing, Bret Uarte returned to Eugland about the middle of August [1878] for a short vacation, which proved, however, to be rather a long one. His particular object was a visit to James Anthony Froude, at his house in Devonshire. Brete Harte had great admiration for Eroude's writiugs.
From Froude's home Bret Harte wrote to his wife as follows:

Imagine, if you can, something between Locksley Hall and the High Walled Garden, where Maud used to walk, and you have some idea of this graceful English home. I look from my wiudows down upon the exquisite lawns and terraces, all sloping toward the sea wall, and then down upon the blue sea below.
"I walk out oin the long, bigh gardeu, past terraces looking over the ruins of an old feudel castle, and I cau scarcely belicve I am not reading an English novel.
"To heighten the absurdity. when I return to my room I am coufronted by the iuscription un the door, 'Lord Devon' (for this is the property of the Earl of Devon, and I occupy his favorite room). Froude is a commection of the Earl's, and bas hired the house for the summer.

- But Fronde-dear old noble fellow-is spleudid. I love him more than I ever did in America. He is great, broad, manly,-demecratic in the best sense of the word, scorning all sy cophancy and meauness, accepting all that is around bim, yet more prond of his literary profession than of his kınship with these people whom he quietly con these people whom he quietly con-
trols, There are ouly a few literary mer like him here, but they are kiugs. So far I've avoided seeing ally company here; but Eroude and I walk and walk, and talk and talk,' - Henry Childs Merwin's "Life of Bret Harte"
