## NHOLE NATION MOVES

 TO BANISH SOLITUDEJur Heroes Are Calling From Over There-Give What You Can to Help Those From Home.

Every citizen interested in the boys of his home town now at the front, and n the brave women who equally are serving their country abroad, has an piportunity to show his appreclation if the sacrifice they are making. The pportunity comes as a result of the renerosity and thought of Colonel Willam Boyce Thompson of New York, who has concelved and put into execuion what is known as the Home Pa ser Service.
Under the plan, every man and wohan in foreign service will recelve the own newspaper, and so be kept in onstant touch with the places and the eople they know and love.
Every branch of the United States fovernment is interested in the plan. The Government realizes the imporance of keeping those in the service rappy and constantly in touch with heir home ties and assoeiations. Nothng is more depressing in a national mergeney than the spifit of loneliness ${ }^{1}$ it those serving their country, and oficials know that nothing can dispel his feeling more effectually than readng the home town newspaper.
I'thllefiers of newspapers in all parts if the country-this newspaper includ-d-have grasped with pleasure the pian outiined by Colonel Thompson, and they have agreed to co-operate in very way.
Under the ruling of the War Indusries Board newspaper publishers are orbidden to, send their newspapers ree, even to soldiers. The newspaper nust be subscrtbed for in the regular way, the only exception being soldiers who formerly were in the employ of the newspaper and who left that servce to enlist. Colonel Thompson therefore proposes that the public in each ommunity contribute to a fund so that the home newspaper (in our case this hewsiaper) iv: rach every man and woman now ia the service of his counry.
Anyone may contribute to the fund, and any sum may be contrlbuted. It is not necessnry to contribute the entire. tmount of one subscription. It does let matter whether the rich man sends n ane hundred dollars or the poor boy r 1 little kirl sends in five cents. Each fift will be a messaze of love and helpminess to the home town folks "Over There: The money will be lumped nto ona fund. out of which subscripions wiy be entered as fast as the noney is recolvel.

Mrs. Harrisou arrived in Carmel a week ago yesterday, and had bren mogaged up to the hour of the meeting in perfecting the details of her generous gift. Two splendid lots on the north side of Ocean dvenue, rumning 130 feet throngh io Sixth Avenue, were acquired tuil the deeds therefor signed.

Mrs. Harrison's gift embraces not only the land and building, but includes as well thousands of volumes belonging to Judge Harrison and herself, among which are uumerous rare and beautiful works.
Included in the library property twill be a hall, to be used for readings, musicals, lectures, picture exhibitious. club meatings, and social affairs./ Another feature will be a special small building in which will be located the "Music Section" and the "Children's Room."
The institution will be named "The Ralph Chandler Harrison Memorial Library."

While the funds for the erection of the building are available, actual coustruction work canuot be commenced until the end of the owar.
