



Letter From "Red Division" Soldier

It is not so long ago that Cameron Waite was a schoolboy here, and after school hours a fine little worker in the Pine Cone office. From the battle-field in France he writes to Dr. and Mrs. J. E. Beck as follows:

My dear Aunt and Uncle:

Just a few lines to let you know that I received your ever welcome letter

Well, Aunty, we don't have to duck the Germans' six-inchers any more, and I suppose you have read that the Twenty eighth Division was made a Red Division, which honor was awarded for doing the hardest fighting, and, as I understand, we are one of the first divisions to sail for dear old America We expect to be home by Christmas, or shortly after


This is sure a happy country now. It is the first time in nearly five years that the people can leave their windows open and burn lights ius de, and not be bothered with air raids

We are still in the last battle line, but the Germans have started to evacuate, and all one could see today was prisoners coming through who were released by the Germans. Hostilities ceased at 11 o'clock, and from early morning until late at night there was one of the worst barrages I ever saw It seemed that our fellows were trying to shoot all the ammunition in the world before the cessation of hostilities, and the Fritzies were doing the same

Later in the arternoon, the men who had been firing at each other, with intent to kill were out in No Man's Land shaking hands and ex- OSTEOPATHIC PHYSICIAN changing souvenirs. It was one of the funniest things I ever saw. A German to whom I was talking said he wouldn't fight any more - he'd give himself up first.

They were the happiest men in the world, even if they did get very much the worst of ft. I was in the enemy lines eight hours after the end of the fighting, talking with the Bosches; that is, to those who spoke a little English, for I am not much on this Fatherland lingo; but we got along nicely. There was not the least bit of envy or hatred shown by a single one of those Germans, who only a few hours previous were being shot at by us.

We landed in France on June 1. went into the trenches to relieve infantry on June 16, and have been in the scrap till the end. So of course you see I did not have much pleasure in France. But I enlisted to fight, and I have done my bit as well as I could, and now that it is termed. over, I am glad I was in it. Of course, I went through a lot of dear old U.S. A, also to be able to gas, but I can proudly say I be-long until I see you both, and can longed to the Twenty-eighth, one have a good long talk. of the "Fighting Reds," as they are Lovingly, Cameron
