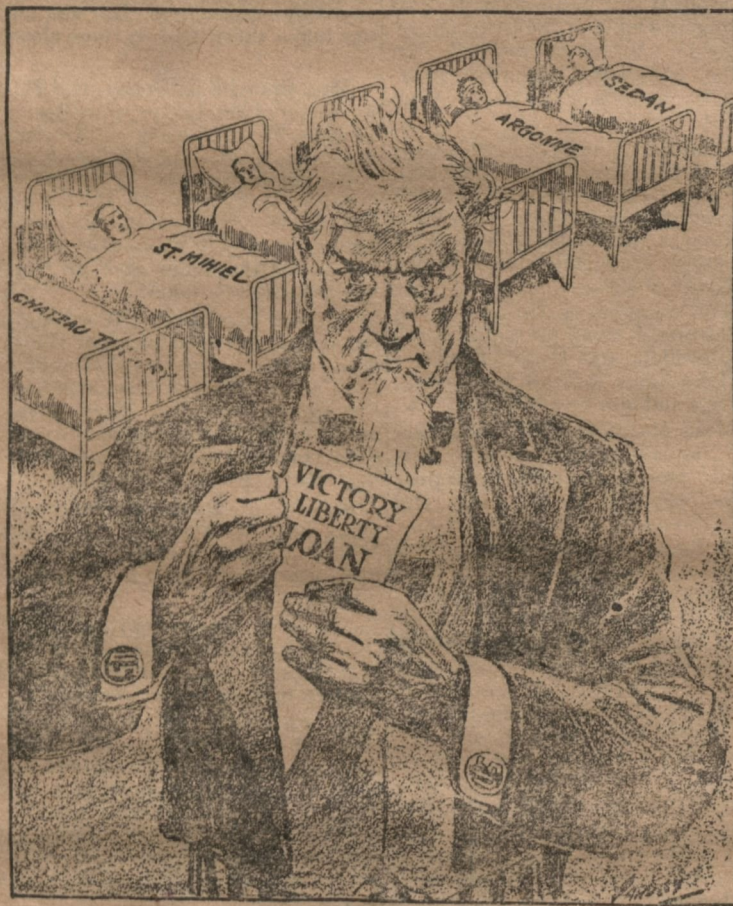

Carmel Boy Home From Overseas

Corporal Donald L. Hale, son of Mrs. F. R. Bechdolt, is home from Europe, after an absence of over a year with the American Expeditionary Force.

But a very short time after the United States declared war on Germany Hale enlisted in San Francisco, joining the 30th Engineers (Gas and Flame), which later became the First Gas Regiment, and which, after a period of Training at Fort Meyer, Virginia, sailed for France in January, 1918.

Corporal Hale has seen much real service. From the start the First Gas Regiment was in the heaviest of the fighting. Because of their peculiar duties the gas fighters had to be in front, to pave the way for the infantry and draw the enemy artillery fire.

Toward the end of April last year the First Gas Regiment was used in all sectors in which there were American forces, and took an active part in the engagements at Toule, the Vosges, Chateau Thierry, St. Mihiel and the Argonne. At one time the gas fighters fought forty out of forty-nine consecutive days, and through it all Donald Hale came through without a scratch.

The officers and men of the regiment were awarded eighty Croix de Guerre, twenty-six Distinguished Service Crosses and twelve officers have been cited for our Army's Distinguished Service Medal—a remarkable showing for a single regiment.

Will Pass Through Carmel

One of the most important matters which will come before the State Legislature when the members reconvene at Sacramento will be the state highway which has just been surveyed by state engineers from a point near Posts in this county to a point just south of the Monterey county line, a distance of fifty-three miles. This is the "missing link" in the state highway between San Francisco and Los Angeles, and it is a highway which will prove of great benefit not only to Monterey and Monterey county in general but to the entire state as well, for it will make available vast undeveloped wealth in minerals, timber, agricultural and horticultural lands. It will pass through the great forest reserve of Monterey county, the largest tract of undeveloped reserve in California. The tract has within its boundaries hundreds of acres of giant redwoods, and also spruce and tanbark trees.

It also contains gold and silver mines, chrome deposits of great value, and thousands of acres that will be made available for agriculture, horticulture, dairying and stock raising. The opening up of this primeval forest and the adjacent farming lands will add immensely to the taxable property of the state, and in this way the people of the entire state will be benefitted.

It will prove of immense value to Monterey city and Monterey county, as it will bring here every year thousands of tourists who would otherwise never visit this section.

County Surveyor Howard F. Cozens has just compiled a map of the proposed highway and it shows in detail the lands, forests and mines
