The V Loan, meaning the Fifth or Victory campaign opens next Monday. Subscribers to the first, second and third loans were required to pay either in full or in four payments. The fourth loan was easier, making it five payments. But the Victory Loan terms are better still, as shown by the following:

10% with application on or before May 10.

10% on or before July 15.

20% on or before August 12.

20% on or before September 9.

20% on or before October 7.

20% on or before November 11, with accrued interest on deferred installments.

Payment in full can be made on May 20, the 10 per cent required with application having been duly paid and or before May 10. Payment can also be completed on any installment date with accrued interest.
